Dorothy began her 16 years teaching career in the Camden City Public Schools. She worked in various positions during her teaching tenure; at McGraw School, East Camden Middle School, Cramer School and her first teaching job started at Yorkship School. She also taught evening GED Mathematics course at Woodrow Wilson High School.

In 1993, Dorothy A. Burley was sworn in as the first African American Female Municipal Clerk for the City of Camden. She later worked and retired from CAMcare Health Corporation as the Director of Human Resources. After retiring, Dorothy continued to volunteer and assist in community service projects for the residents of Camden.

Dorothy held many appointed and elected membership positions including Camden County and Camden City Democratic Committee and the Fairview Neighbors. Ms. Burley was instrumental in working with numerous elected officials on the Federal, State, County and Municipal levels to better serve her community.
