EDUCATIONAL

The use of a building or structure, by six or more persons at any one time for educational purposes through the 12th grade.

Religious educational rooms and religious auditoriums, which are accessory to *places of religious worship* in accordance with Section 303.1 and have *occupant loads* of less than 100, shall be classified as A-3 occupancies.

Day care. The use of a building or structure, or portion thereof, for educational, supervision or *personal care services* for more than five children older than 2 1/ 2 years of age, shall be classified as a Group E occupancy.

MERCANTILE

The use of a building or structure for the display and sale of merchandise, and involves stocks of goods, wares or merchandise incidental to such purposes and accessible to the public.
