### New Business

## 1. New Jersey Association on Corrections

311 Market St

Mr. Steve Cohen appeared before the commission. He is proposing exterior improvements to 311 Market St. (a historically significant property on Market St). The proposed improvements include the windows, doors, and steps. Mr. Cohen indicated that the proposed materials for the steps is concrete. Mr. Schoop suggested marble materials for the steps. The proposed materials for the windows is Pella Windows (Clad). Mr. Schoop recommended that wood is more acceptable. Mr. Cohen suggested that the double doors will remain. Mr. Yoder recommended that the materials for the doors use wood (Pella). Mr. Cohen indicated that the transom will remain. Mr. Yoder recommended treatment to the

door with molding to resemble a double door. Mr. Schoop recommended a treatment (gold leaf) over the transom.

Mr. Sanchez rescued himself from this application.

Mr. Martin moved to approve; Mr. Yoder seconded. Motion approved (4/0)(1 recusal).

# 2. William Hargrove

## 698 Cooper St

Mr. Jeffery Brennan appeared before the commission on behalf the applicant. The applicant is proposing to install a 6'fence around said property (Parking Lot) next to an existing fence at the rear of the property. Mr. Brennan indicated that the fence will be an aluminum (black in color) fence. The purpose of the fence is to protect buses and other vehicles from theft based on testimony from representatives of the applicant.

Mr. Brennan indicated that the aluminum represent the fence materials, but preferred wrought iron if possible to provide longevity. Mr. Schopp agree with the wrought iron fencing with either a hairpin or Spear points. Mr. Brennan preferred the hairpin to minimize liability.
