Please note summary of Public Decorum rules below.

Rule XVII: Decorum

Any person who shall disturb the peace of the Council, make impertinent or slanderous remarks or conduct himself in a boisterous manner while addressing the Council shall be forthwith barred by the presiding officer from further audience before the Council, except that if the speaker shall submit to proper order under these rules, permission for him to continue may be granted by a majority vote of the Council.

City Council meetings shall be conducted in a courteous manner. Citizens and Council members will be allowed to state their positions in an atmosphere free of slander, threats of violence or the use of Council as a forum for politics. Sufficient warnings may be given by the Chair at any time during the remarks and, in the event that any individual shall violate the rules of decorum heretofore set forth, the Chairperson may then cut off comment or debate. At the discretion of the Chairperson, light signals may be used to display the commencement of the time for speaking and a warning light may be flashed to show that the appropriate time has passed. A red light will signal that there is no longer time.



ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF BLOCK 177, LOT 65 TO THE CAMDEN REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CRA)

WHEREAS, the City desires to transfer the parcel known as 431 Stevens Street, Block 177, Lot 65 (the "Property") to the Camden Redevelopment Agency ("CRA") for the sale and future development of the new Planned Parenthood facility in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00); and

WHEREAS, Planned Parenthood of Northern, Central, and Southern New Jersey (Planned Parenthood) proposes to acquire properties designated in Block 177 on the City of Camden Tax Map to relocate from a site on Broadway and construct a new medical office and facility, which are permitted uses within the redevelopment plan's University and Support Zone in the City. Planned Parenthood, in operation in Camden since 1995, considers access to primary and preventative health care and impacting area social determinants of health as central to its mission, and the proposed new facility allow for increased services and operations in a more modern and efficient facility; and

WHEREAS, that said premises shall be developed within three (3) years from the date of this deed; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Camden that the proper officer(s) shall be and are hereby authorized to execute the necessary Deed to the Camden Redevelopment Agency transferring this parcel in accordance with terms set forth herein.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 OF THE CITY OF CAMDEN CITY CODE, PARKING AUTHORITY, FORMERLY CHAPTER 5; WHICH WAS CREATED BY ORDINANCE NO. 1169, ADOPTED ON OCTOBER 23, 1958, AND FURTHER AMENDED BY MC-4810, ADOPTED ON FEBRUARY 21, 2014, TO PROVIDE THE PARKING AUTHORITY WITH THE FULL AUTHORITY AS SPECIFIED IN PARKING AUTHORITY LAW, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DESIGNATING PARKING ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WITH AUTHORITY TO ISSUES SUMMONS AND TO CAUSE VEHICLES PARKED, STORED OR ABANDONED IN THE CITY OF CAMDEN, IN VIOLATION OF LAW, CITY CODE OR REGULATIONS, TO BE TOWED AND FOR THE PARKING AUTHORITY TO CAUSE TO BE COLLECTED THE COSTS OF TOWING AND STORAGE OF SAID VEHICLE

WHEREAS, this City Council of the City of Camden has determined that it is in the best interests of the City of Camden that Chapter 7; Article XIII, Section 7-70, Parking Authority, formerly Chapter 5, which was created by Ordinance No. 1169, adopted on October 23, 1958, and further amended and supplemented by Municipal Ordinance MC-4810, adopted on February 21, 2014, be amended; and

WHEREAS, this City Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City of Camden that the Parking Authority have the ability and authority, as provided for in the Parking Authority Law, as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-6(2), for "the management and operation of onstreet and other parking meters and related facilities and enforcement of the applicable law, ordinances and regulations as to the parking of vehicles in" the City of Camden, "and the consequent promotion of free movement of traffic and relief of traffic congestion on the streets" of the City of Camden and "improvement of conditions affecting the public safety and welfare therein"; and

WHEREAS, this City Council has also determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City of Camden that the Parking Authority have the ability and authority, as provided for in the Parking Authority Law, as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22 (3)(c), to have full enforcement authority, on behalf of the City of Camden "of all or any of the applicable law, ordinances, and regulations as to the parking of vehicles" in the City of Camden, "whether upon streets or on lands or other facilities owned or maintained" by the City of Camden or the Parking Authority or elsewhere; and

WHEREAS, this City Council has also determined that it is in the best interests of the residents of the City of Camden that the Parking Authority have the ability and authority, as provided for in the Parking Authority law, as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22(3)(d) to designate Parking Enforcement Officers, who shall meet the requirements of the Parking Authority Law, with full power and authority within the City of Camden to issue summonses for violations of parking laws, City ordinances and regulations and for any vehicle parked, stored or abandoned in violation of law, City ordinances or regulations, to cause it to be towed away from the scene of the violation; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22(3)(d) also permits the Parking Authority to cause to be collected from an owner of such towed vehicle the costs of the towing and subsequent storage of such vehicle before surrendering said vehicle to such owner; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden and the Parking Authority plan to enter into a Shared Services Agreement (SSA) for the purpose of the City of Camden to provide the Parking Authority with the authority to assume control of all towing operations for the City of Camden, including but not limited to, the towing and storage of illegally parked and abandoned vehicles in the City of Camden and this SSA will also establish the allocation of costs and fees associated with this this arrangement, and as provided for in the Parking Authority Law, as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22 (3); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Camden now seeks to grant the authority to the Parking Authority as described herein; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Camden in Camden County, in the State of New Jersey, that Chapter 7, Article XIII, Section 7-70; <u>Parking Authority</u>, is hereby amended as follows:

§7-70. Parking Authority.

- A. Same. [The body corporate and politic known as the "Parking Authority of the City of Camden," heretofore created and established pursuant to the provisions of the Parking Authority Law, (N.J.S.A. 40:11A-1 et seq.) is hereby continued].
- B. Same. [Said Parking Authority shall possess and exercise all of the rights and powers, and perform all of the functions and duties, as provided by and in accordance with said Parking Law, including, without limitation, the full exercise of the power of eminent domain, subject, however, to the following limitations contained therein].
- C. Same. [Said Parking Authority may acquire any real property by the power of eminent domain without the consent of city Council, except for occupied residential units].
- D. Pursuant to the Parking Authority Law as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-6(2), the Parking Authority shall have ability and the authority for "the management and operation of onstreet and other parking meters and related facilities and enforcement of the applicable law, ordinances and regulations as to the parking of vehicles" within the entire City of Camden, "and the consequent promotion of free movement of traffic and relief of traffic congestion on the streets" of the City of Camden and "improvement of conditions affecting the public safety and welfare therein"; and
- E. Pursuant to the Parking Authority Law as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22 (3)(c), the Parking Authority shall have enforcement authority, on behalf of the City of Camden "of all or any applicable law, ordinances, and regulations as to the parking of vehicles" in the City of Camden, "whether upon streets or on lands or other facilities owned or maintained" by the City of Camden or the Parking Authority or elsewhere; and
- F. Pursuant to the Parking Authority Law as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22(3)(d), the Parking Authority shall have the ability and authority to designate Parking Enforcement Officers, as defined at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22.1, who shall meet all of the requirements of the Parking Authority Law, with full power and authority within the entire City of Camden to issue summonses for violations of parking laws, City ordinances and regulations and for any vehicle parked, stored or abandoned in violation of law, City ordinances or regulations within the City of Camden, to cause it to be towed away from the scene of the violation; and
- G. Pursuant to the Parking Authority Law, as specified at N.J.S.A. 40:11A-22(3)(d), the Parking Authority, on its own, or through the procurement of a contractor, shall have the ability and authority to establish towing and storage fees, and to cause to be collected from an owner of a towed vehicle which was parked, stored or abandoned in violation of law, City ordinances or regulations, the costs of the towing and subsequent storage of such vehicle before surrendering said vehicle to such owner.
- H. The Parking Authority shall also have the authority to exercise all other authority in the Parking Authority Law, N.J.S.A. 40:11A-1 et seq., which is not inconsistent with this ordinance.

 To the extent that the City of Camden creates or modifies any ordinance concerning illegally parked or abandoned vehicles within the City of Camden, and the towing and storage of same, the enforcement authority of the Parking Authority, as described herein, shall remain in full force and effect, unless that newly created or amended ordinance specifies otherwise.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final passage and publication as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Mayor, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to approve or veto this Ordinance. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF ACTION: City Administration has determined it is in the best interests of the residents of the City of Camden that the Parking Authority of the City of Camden has the ability and authority, as provided for in the Parking Authority Law for:

- For the management and operation of on street and other parking meters and related facilities and enforcement of the applicable law, ordinances and regulations as to the parking of vehicles in Camden, and the consequent promotion of free movement of traffic and relief of traffic congestion on the streets of the City and improvement of conditions affecting the public safety and welfare therein;"
- 2. To have full enforcement authority, on behalf of the City of all or any of the applicable law, ordinances, and regulations as to the parking of vehicles in the City of Camden, whether upon streets or on lands or other facilities owned or maintained by the City or the Parking Authority or elsewhere;
- 3. To designate Parking Enforcement Officers, who shall meet the requirements of the Parking Authority Law, with full power and authority within the City to issue summonses for violations of parking laws, City ordinances and regulations and for any vehicle parked, stored or abandoned in violation of law, City ordinances or regulations, to cause it to be towed away from the scene of the violation; and
- 4. To permit the Parking Authority to cause to be collected from an owner of such towed vehicle the costs of the towing and subsequent storage of such vehicle before surrendering said vehicle to such owner.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 803 (VEHICLES, ABANDONED) OF THE CITY CODE

WHEREAS, the City Council understands that Chapter 803 (Vehicles, Abandoned) currently regulates the impoundment, disposition, reclamation, and scrapping of vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden understands that Chapter 803 needs to be further amended to facilitate the City of Camden's efficient impoundment, disposition, reclamation, and scrapping of vehicles, under said Chapter, all in compliance with current state law governing the same; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden seeks to amend this Chapter to permit both the Parking Authority of the City of Camden and the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, to oversee the ticketing and towing, as necessary, of illegally parked or abandoned vehicles in the City of Camden and on behalf of the City of Camden; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Camden that Chapter 803, Sections 1 through 12 are hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 548: VEHICLES, ABANDONED

§ 803-1 Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles created.

- A. On behalf of the City of Camden, there shall be created a Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles within the Department of Administration.
- B. The head of the Bureau shall be the Business Administrator or his designee.
- C. The powers of the Bureau may be performed by the Business Administrator or employees of the Department of Administration designated by the Business Administrator or by officials of the Parking Authority, or by officials of the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division or an agent or agents acting under a contract approved by the City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division. Authorized officials of said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, shall be vested with the authority to enforce any and all ordinances providing for ticketing of illegally parked or abandoned vehicles and said Bureau, the Parking Authority and the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts, shall also be vested with the authority to enforce any and all ordinances providing for towing, immobilizing and impounding of abandoned and unclaimed vehicles and the collection of all fees and fines therein

§ 803-2 Identification of abandoned vehicles; impoundment.

Any motor vehicle which is unclaimed and/or abandoned within the City of Camden is hereby declared to be a nuisance and the same may be summarily abated by the removal thereof and impoundment thereof, as follows:

A. Upon discovery of a vehicle suspected of being unclaimed or abandoned by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, a sticker, stating that this vehicle shall be deemed to be abandoned and unclaimed if not removed within 48 hours, shall be affixed to such vehicle by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, unless an authorized official from said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division determines that immediate towing is necessary.

- B. Upon discovery of a motor vehicle found unclaimed and abandoned by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, the taking of possession shall be reported immediately to the Director of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 on a form prescribed by said Director for verification of ownership.
- C. Upon discovery of a motor vehicle suspected to be unclaimed and abandoned by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, and prior to taking possession of said motor vehicle, an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall confirm whether the motor vehicle is to be considered stolen. If, after the allotted time as outlined in § 803-2A has expired, the owner of said vehicle has not voluntarily removed said vehicle, said vehicle may be removed under the direction or at the request of any authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, by means of towing or otherwise to a storage lot as designated by said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division. Upon the removal of a vehicle to a storage lot, said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall institute the notice requirements of N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1.

§ 803-3 Sale of vehicles and property remaining unclaimed.

- A. When an impounded motor vehicle shall have remained unclaimed by the owner or other person having legal right thereof for the period of time as provided for in N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1, the same may be sold at auction in a public place or otherwise disposed of, as provided for in N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 and this Chapter. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, shall give notice of such sale or other disposition of the vehicle which shall be made in conformity with N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1, describing said vehicle with reasonable clarity by manufacturer's trade name or make, motor number and license number and stating therein the name of any owner or any holder of a security interest, if known. Furthermore, all sales or other dispositions of vehicles shall be made in conformity with N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 and this Chapter.
- B. Any tangible personal property found within said vehicle shall be turned over to the said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, for disposition of sale pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-157.

§ 803-4 Use of proceeds from sale.

Any proceeds obtained from the sale of a vehicle at public auction or other disposition of a vehicle in excess of the amount owed to said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts for the costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicle, and any fines, penalties and court costs assessed against the owner of the vehicle for a violation that gave rise to the impoundment or immobilization of the vehicle and any outstanding warrants against the motor vehicle shall be returned to the owner of the vehicle if his address and name are known. Otherwise, the proceeds of the sale or other disposition in excess of the amount owed to said Bureau, the Parking Authority, or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, shall be retained by the said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division.

- A. The owner of the vehicle is also responsible for any fine or penalty or court costs assessed against him for rendering such vehicle as unclaimed and abandoned.
- B. Any fines, penalties and charges derived herein shall be paid to said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division,

§ 803-5 Vehicles with Outstanding Warrants or Unpaid Parking Tickets.

- A. Vehicles located within the City of Camden which are identified as having outstanding warrants or three (3) or more delinquent traffic or parking tickets shall be subject to Chapter 815 of the City of Camden Code.
- B. Any tangible personal property found within said motor vehicle shall be turned over to said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division for disposition of sale pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-157.

§ 803-6 Reclaiming of impounded vehicles upon payment of costs.

At any time prior to the sale, the owner of the motor vehicle or other person entitled to the motor vehicle may reclaim possession of the motor vehicle upon payment of the costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicle. Additionally, the fines, penalties and court costs assessed against the owner or other person entitled to the motor vehicle which gave rise to the removal and impoundment thereof must also be paid.

§ 803-7 Reclamation costs.

- A. The reclamation costs for the towing, impoundment and storage of the vehicle, if performed directly by the city or its employees, are as follows:
 - (1) For a vehicle placed at a City storage lot, storage fees for that vehicle shall be:
 - (a) First day (first 24-hour period); no charge.
 - (b) A limit of \$3.00 per day for the 2nd through 30th days;
 - (c) A limit of \$2.00 per day thereafter.
- B. For vehicles which are towed by private contractor(s) who have been awarded the contract as the result of public bidding by the City, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division and placed on a City storage lot, the towing fees shall be those arising pursuant to the City Contract to provide for the removal and storage of abandoned, disabled and impounded vehicles and the storage fees shall be those listed in §803-7 A (1).
- C. For vehicles which are towed by private contractor(s) who have been awarded contract(s) as the result of public bidding by the City, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division and are stored at the private contractor's storage facility, then the reclamation costs shall be those provided for in the contract between the City, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division and the private contractor(s).

§ 803-8 Junk title for old vehicles.

When any towed vehicle has been determined by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, to be eligible for junk title as defined by N.J.S.A. 39:10A-3, junk title may be sought from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission and the vehicle shall be sold or otherwise disposed of and such sale or other disposition of the vehicle shall be made in conformity with N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 and this Chapter.

§ 803-9 Scrap vehicles.

A. Whenever any abandoned or unclaimed motor vehicle has been so deteriorated, damaged or stripped of useable parts as to be rendered to scrap and thus no longer a motor vehicle, an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division are authorized to certify the same as motor vehicle scrap. Such motor vehicle scrap may be sold or otherwise disposed of and removed to a scrap processing company or junk dealer. Said disposition shall be accomplished without the need for title papers, certificate of ownership, junk title certificate or any further certification or verification from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission or notification to the owner thereof of advertisement of sale.

- B. No such motor vehicle scrap shall be removed from private property by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division. Any vehicle identified as scrap pursuant to §803-9A, shall not be sold or otherwise disposed for a period of twenty (20) business days and the sale or other disposition of the vehicle is to be made in accordance with state statutes and this Chapter.
- C. Upon disposition of motor vehicle scrap thereof by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, the vehicle identification number thereof and any motor vehicle registration plate attached thereto shall be turned into the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, destroyed or obliterated. The certificate as motor vehicle scrap shall include a picture thereof and shall be made on such form and in such detail as prescribed by the Director of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall keep, as a public record, the name and address of the purchaser or recipient of said motor vehicle scrap and the terms of transfer thereof for a period as prescribed by law.
- D. For all All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) or other similar types of off-road vehicles, which are towed to and stored by said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts, this section shall apply. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall promptly notify the owner and any known holder of a security interest that the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle is being stored on a contractor's lot. If the owner and any known holder of a security interest of the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle fails to respond to the notice within thirty (30) days, the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle, may be sold at public auction or otherwise disposed of as scrap and removed to a scrap processing company or junk dealer Notice of the sale or other disposition of the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle, shall be given by certified mail, to the owner, if his name and address be known, and any known holder of a security interest, and by publication in one or more newspapers published in this state and circulating in the city, at least five days before the date of the sale or other disposition. Said disposition shall be accomplished without the need for title papers, certificate of ownership, junk title certificate or any further certification or verification from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, the Business Administrator or his designee or the Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles.

§ 803-10 Sale of vehicles without title certificates.

Upon the sale of a motor vehicle to a Third Party Purchaser for which standard or junk title cannot be obtained from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts shall provide the purchaser with a bill of sale or other similar document indicating the purchase made by the Third Party Purchaser.

§ 548-11 Liability of City for vehicles sold.

The City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, upon sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, give no warranties or guaranties of any nature whatsoever. Furthermore, upon the sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, all claims of interest therein shall be forever barred as provided by the laws of the State of New Jersey, and the City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, sells, or for other disposition, otherwise gives up all right, title and interest which they may have in said motor vehicle and is released from any liability concerning said sale or other disposition or said taking. Upon the sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, such liability shall be the responsibility of the purchaser or the recipient.

§ 548-12 Other penalties allowed.

The impounding or immobilizing of a motor vehicle shall not preclude or prevent the institution of prosecution for any criminal or any other violation of a city ordinance or state statute in any court of this state, including the Municipal Court, against the owner or operator of such impounded or immobilized vehicle.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any portion of the City Code not herein amended and supplemented shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance. Furthermore, the other provisions of this ordinance are deemed to be severable and remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23 and N.J.S.A. 40:69A-41, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Mayor, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to approve or veto this Ordinance. Additionally, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the State Commissioner of Community Affairs, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to veto this Ordinance, and the action by the Commissioner regarding this Ordinance shall supersede any action by the Mayor on the same Ordinance. All notices of approval and/or veto shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

ORDIANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 815 VEHICLES, IMMOBILIZATION AND IMPOUNDMENT OF

§ 815-1. Statutory authority.

New Jersey Statutes Annotated 39:4-139.13 authorizes the City of Camden to enact an ordinance authorizing the impoundment or immobilization of vehicles found within the City if there are any outstanding warrants against such vehicles. The Camden City Council hereby exercises this authority and delegates to the City of Camden Parking Authority and its agents the authority to impound or immobilize motor vehicles found within the City if there are any outstanding warrants against such vehicles.

§ 815-2. Impoundment; liability for damage. [Amended 4-26-1990 by Ord. No. MC-2539]

Any vehicle unlawfully parked within the City of Camden for a period in excess of 30 minutes or any vehicle which is operated in violation of the motor vehicle laws of the State of New Jersey or any vehicle for which there are any outstanding warrants or three or more delinquent parking tickets may be taken into possession or immobilized by the City of Camden Parking Authority or its designee. The City, the Parking Authority, their agents, servants or employees shall not be responsible or liable in any manner for damage incurred in towing, storage, immobilization, possession or disposition of such vehicles.

§ 815-3. Fee. [Amended 12-28-1990 by Ord. No. MC-2612]

In the event that a vehicle is immobilized for unpaid parking violations as provided in § 815-2 of this chapter, an immobilization fee of \$60 shall be assessed.

§ 815-4. Sale of impounded vehicle; notice.

If any outstanding warrants are not paid by 12:00 midnight of the 30th day following the day on which the vehicle was impounded or immobilized, the vehicle may be sold at public auction. The City shall give notice of the sale by certified mail to the owner, if his name is known, and to the holder of any security interest filed with the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles, and by publication in the form prescribed by the Director of Motor Vehicles, by one insertion, at least five days before the date of the sale, in one or more newspapers published in this state and circulating in the City. Vehicles owned by lessors who have complied with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-139.2 et seq. respecting lessors shall not be sold.

§ 815-5. Release upon payment. [Amended 12-28-1990 by Ord. No. MC-2612]

- A. At any time prior to the sale, the owner of the motor vehicle or other person entitled to the motor vehicle may reclaim possession of it upon payment of:
 - (1) The reasonable costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicle, including a towing charge for removal and storage of said vehicle, not to exceed the amount as specified in any contract between the Parking Authority and its contractor for the towing and storage of said vehicle.
 - (2) Any fines imposed by this chapter.
- (3) Any fine or penalty and court costs assessed against the owner of the vehicle for violation(s) which gave rise to the impoundment or immobilization of the vehicle, including any outstanding warrants against such vehicle.
- B. The owner-lessor of a motor vehicle who has complied with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-139.2 et seq. respecting owners-lessors shall be entitled to reclaim possession without payment and the lessee shall be liable for any fine, penalty, court costs and outstanding warrants against the vehicle.

§ 815-6. Disposition of sale proceeds.

Any proceeds obtained from the sale of the vehicle at public auction in excess of the amount owed to the City, the Parking Authority or an agent or agents acting under a contract approved by the City of Camden or the Parking Authority for the reasonable costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicles and any fines or penalties and court costs assessed against said vehicle for the violation which gave rise to the impoundment or immobilization of the motor vehicle, including any outstanding warrants against such vehicle, shall be returned to the owner of the vehicle, if his or her name and address are known.

§ 815-7. Prohibited acts.

- A. It shall be unlawful and an offense for any person to impair, render inoperative or cause any person to impair or render inoperative any immobilization device which has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.
- B. It shall be unlawful and an offense for any person to move or cause to be moved any vehicle, wherever immobilized which has been immobilized in accordance with this chapter.

§ 815-8. Violations and penalties. [Amended 10-12-2006 by Ord. No. MC-4234]

Unless otherwise provided in the chapter, penalties against persons violating the provisions of this shall be imposed in accordance with the provisions of § 1-15.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE STREET VACATION FOR SPECTRUM CAPITAL CAMDEN, LLC FOR BLOCK 110, LOTS 11, 16, 49, 51 (QUALIFIER) B-01 AND 67, 1107 PENN STREET, NS AD WILSON 74 E OF 11TH STREET, 1182 LINDEN STREET, 112-1156 LINDEN STREET AND SS LINDEN 418 E. 11TH STREET

WHEREAS, Spectrum Capital Camden, LLC has requested a street vacation of portions of certain alleyways for the propose of constructing a hotel located at Block 110, Lots 11, 16, 49, 51, 51 (Qualifer) B-01 and 67, 1107 Penn Street, NS AD Wilson 74 E of 11th Street, 1182 Linden Street, 1112-1156 Linden Street and SS Linden 418 E. 11th Street, Camden, NJ; and

The party or parties who become owners of the vacated streets must maintain fire access to the vacated streets at all times.

SECTION 3. The street vacations are subject to the rights of the City of Camden and of public utilities to enter the vacated streets in a reasonable manner for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, replacing, closing or removing any municipal public utility or cable television lines and/or facilities remaining in, on or under the vacated streets, unless the City of Camden or public utility or cable television company waives such right by contract or agreement under Section 2 above.

SECTION 4. The Municipal Clerk shall have this ordinance published once, not less than (10) days instead of one (1) week prior to the second reading.

Article III. Zoning Districts, Rules and Regulations

§ 870-43. Issuance of approvals and relief from provisions requiring no indebtedness to City; installment

[Amended 3-11-2014 by Ord. No. MC-4820]

- No person, taxable association, entity, partnership or corporation shall be entitled to any approval, relief or remedy under this article by the Zoning Officer, Planning Board or the Zoning Board of Adjustment of the City of Camden, or any other commissions having advisory powers pursuant to this article, unless a certification is obtained from the Tax Collector of the City of Camden showing the applicant or petitioner to be free and clear of any and all monetary obligations owing to the City of Camden by way of municipal taxes, fees, water and sewer charges, judgment or any other indebtedness created by law, or that the applicant has entered into an appropriate installment agreement with the Tax Collector for the payment of the aggregate outstanding amount of taxes, assessments, municipal charges, and other indebtedness owed to the City by installment payments and that the applicant is in full compliance with the terms of that agreement. ż
- water and sewer charges, judgment or any other indebtedness owed to the City shall be paid to the City. Each applicant seeking to enter into an installment agreement with the City pursuant to this section shall provide the Tax Collector with such information deemed relevant in determining the applicant has sufficient income to discharge his/her obligation to make installment payments. All installment agreements subject to this section shall provide for a down payment of at least 10% of the aggregate outstanding amount of taxes, assessments, municipal charges, and other indebtedness owed to the City and for the full satisfaction of the balance of the aforesaid aggregate amount in substantially equal monthly installments over a period not to exceed three years. The down payment required under this section may be reduced or Installment payments under an agreement made pursuant to this section shall be regularly and promptly made to the City. Additionally, all current municipal taxes, fees, waived only if the applicant demonstrates an ability to pay by installment payments but does not have the necessary down payment. മ
- If an installment or current tax, assessment, municipal charge, or other indebtedness to the City is not paid when due or is not completed within the time fixed by the installment agreement, or there is any other default under the installment agreement, the applicant will have 30 days to make such payment. During the aforesaid thirty-day cure period, all approvals, relief, or remedy granted hereunder shall be suspended until such time as the default shall be cured. If the payment is not made or other default not cured, the installment agreement shall be cancelled and the municipality shall be entitled to exercise all of its rights under law with respect to the outstanding amount of taxes, assessments, municipal charges, and other indebtedness owed to the City. Additionally, if the installment agreement is cancelled, all approvals, remedy or relief granted hereunder shall be rescinded and revoked and shall not be reinstated unless the aggregate indebtedness is paid in full. ပ

Article XXIX. Design Standards for Subdivision and Site Plans

§ 870-230. Parking and loading requirements.

All required parking and loading facilities shall be paved with an all-weather impervious surface and shall be completed prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy. 



About the Project

I. Project Title:

Camden: Equity through Access

I. Project Executive Summary (500 Characters)

The City of Camden will collaborate with local nonprofits and the regional MPO to identify and create a community-driven project that will transform underutilized properties owned by the Parking Authority of the City of Camden (PACC) into transit-system assets that will enhance access and mobility within the service area. The project maximizes local resident utilization of planned NJDOT transit projects and improves system conditions and reliability of service in an area of persistent poverty.

 Project Statement of Work (one sentence summarizing request): (1000 Characters)

This funding request is for planning and project development that will bridge existing institutional gaps between the PACC, the City of Camden, and the regional and State transit planning community.

PACC was created in 1958 pursuant to the New Jersey Parking Authority Act of 1948. It's original mission was aligned with the post - WWII moment in American history that also led to the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1965, which resulted in a private automobile oriented infrastructure. Following the lead of the 2021 FTA, the PACC has realized that it's mission must expand so that it might plan to utilize it's real estate to achieve mobility goals beyond private parking so that it can help achieve environmental and racial equity for Camden's poorest residents.

This project will provide safe transportation alternatives for residents by improving agency coordination, adding to the existing body of Camden-based community engagement work, and implementing regional transit planning best practices.

General Information

 Describe how this application would address racial equity and/or environmental justice in persistent poverty communities. Environmental justice populations include low income and minority populations(s) as defined in Executive Order 12898 "Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations" and FTA's Environmental Justice Circular 4703.1:(4,000 Characters)

This application addresses both racial equity and environmental justice in a persistent poverty community. For this application, "Racial Minority" is defined as all racial groups excluding white individuals. "Ethnic Minority" is defined as anyone of Hispanic or Latino origin, regardless of race. Therefore, the total minority population is the sum of these two groups, encompassing all individuals except non ☐ Hispanic whites. For Camden City, this group is 94.2% of the population, or about 69,295 racial minority individuals, as of the July 1, 2019 population estimates. This follows guidance from U.S. DOT Order 5610.2(a), Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low ☐ Income Populations.

This project addresses the transportation needs of the City of Camden population, access to those needs, and differences in those factors among different population groups. Residents that will benefit from the project, defined as the Census Block Groups within the City of Camden, are projected to derive significant benefit from this project. Using data from the American Community Survey (ACS) by block group, the demographic composition of the City of Camden can be compared to the Philadelphia Camden Wilmington Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) as a whole. Projects such as this one are particularly important to populations without access to personal vehicles, or with otherwise limited transportation access. Using ACS data on vehicle ownership, it is clear the project serves an area with a greater concentration of households without vehicles than the MSA as a whole. The percent of households without vehicles in the immediate project area is more than 2.5 times that of the MSA.

This project promotes racial equity, addresses barriers to opportunity, and serves underserved communities, as per the language found in Executive Order 13985.1. This project also takes guidance from Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and the Executive Order on Environmental Justice to identify population groups and measures relevant to equity.

This application adheres to Executive Order 12898 by developing a strategy for implementing environmental justice. The project includes incorporation of environmentally sustainable methods into planning and development phases. Planning discussions will specifically address identification of the adverse health and environmental effects on minority and low-income populations.

The City of Camden and the Parking Authority of the City of Camden project will result in the direct user benefits of traffic circulation as identified in FTA Environmental Justice Circular 4703:1 by incorporating as much as possible advanced mobility techniques of ride-share vans, electric vehicle charging stations, shared vehicles and scooters/bicycle rental programs. The project will maximize local resident utilization of the planned new Walter Rand Transportation Center and improve system conditions and reliability of service in an area of persistent poverty.

According to the Delaware Regional Planning Commission "Equity Through Access" report, not all transit service in the area is ADA accessible and in fact, some transportation infrastructure can create barriers within and between communities. Camden's transit infrastructure presents several core ADA barriers, and community-engaged planning with an eye toward access will be able to proactively address accessibility.

Any redevelopment guided by this planning process will, by potentially increasing access to mobility options and promoting a walkable Waterfront and Downtown. The project will integrate with the City of Camden's first Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan, which is a separate effort that is being undertaken by the city and the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) throughout 2021. This will provide an evidence-based intervention against health stressors highlighted in N.J.'s Environmental Justice Law S232, including asthma, cancer and cardiovascular disease.

I. Describe how this application supports reducing greenhouse gas emissions and the effects of climate change:

The Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 require that all transportation plans, programs, and projects conform to the purpose of state implementation plans to attain national air quality standards. This project will be tested for conformity and meet all requirements, including the critical test that volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), carbon monoxide (CO), and fine particulate matter (PM2.5) emissions are less than any applicable budgets or baseline established for all analysis years. This project will comply with the complete description of the conformity procedures found in our regional MPO's *Connections 2050* and on DVRPC's Air Quality web page at www.dvrpc.org/AirQuality.

This planning project will take into account recommendations for best practices to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and slow the effects of climate change. As planning, project development, and implementation begin, the City and the Parking Authority will incorporate sustainable design strategies. Any project that comes from this planning

process will incorporate green building techniques wherever financially feasible. Further grant seeking aligned with sustainability measures will be pursued, including through the State of New Jersey. Green building techniques can contribute up to 50% fewer greenhouse gases (GHGs) than conventional buildings due to less water consumption, 48% fewer GHGs due to reduced solid waste and 5% fewer GHGs due to reduction in transportation. Green building components that will garner consideration are the use of natural light, direct heating, passive heating and cooling, solar panels, LED lighting, selective sourcing of materials and directing energy use patterns to curtail and minimize usage.

A component of this planning process is the incorporation of enhanced mobility coordination. This may include the increased usage of public transportation, reduced emission and electric buses, car share, carpooling, electric vehicles, EV charging, bicycles and scooters, and bike share options. Projects that come from this planning process will also contribute to the walkability of the surrounding neighborhood.

The proposed location for this project is the Camden Waterfront transportation center. The Camden Waterfront has recently seen large-scale redevelopment and new attention, and the area is well-trafficked by both residents and visitors. is located in a dense employment center of downtown Trenton. Camden's City Hall and the City Hall PATCO station are all within walking distance of the proposed site. The site location will maximize the utilization of non-personal use vehicles amongst commuters as well as amongst Camden residents.

This project will provide a safe transportation alternative for residents, encouraging greater resident use of outdoor recreation opportunities along the scenic Delaware and Cooper River waterfronts, and bypassing the heavy traffic of US Routes 30 and 130 and I-676. The project will integrate with the City of Camden's first Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan, which is a separate effort that is being undertaken by the city and the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) throughout 2021. It will also directly link users to the City of Philadelphia and the multi–use Circuit Trail network via the Ben Franklin Bridge

While it is difficult to quantify the exact environmental impact of projects that result from this planning process prior to engaging in that process, preliminary estimates are promising. The reduction in VMT from better coordinated transit systems reduces costs associated with air pollution. A reasonable estimation for the incremental savings associated with avoided emissions (NOx, SO2, CO, PM10, etc.) is \$39,620 per year. Additionally, reduced VMT will reduce emissions of CO2. Using current guidance from

the DOT, CO2 emissions (discounted at 3%) are valued at an estimated \$6,432 per year.

I. Matching Funds Information

The Parking Authority of the City of Camden and the City of Camden will work collaboratively to identify additional project planning and project implementation grant funding.

As indicated in the attached "PACC.LOS.pdf" the 10% match required for this application will be provided by the Parking Authority of the City of Camden, from a combination of bond debt, leveraged tax credits, and revenue generated from this project. Matching funds will be applied to later phases of the project, as the most advantageous blend of public and private investment will be identified and raised once the Phase I: Financial Feasibility Study is completed.

Project Scalability

This project has four phases and is scalable to accommodate either Phase I, Phases I and II, or Phases I, II and III, under this grant opportunity.

Phase I includes project planning and has an overall budget of \$97,000. This phase includes community-engaged planning discussions, transit planner oversight, and financial planning including a financial feasibility study and market analysis.

Phase II includes the Engineering and Planning study. has an overall budget of \$472,000 and includes continued community engagement, environmental and geotech site analysis, and engineering / architecture drawings through schematic design.

Phase III has an overall budget of \$277,500 and includes continued community engagement and 100% design development.

Phase IV has an overall budget of \$464,000 and includes complete construction documentation, production and bidding documentation. Phase IV will be funded entirely by the Parking Authority of the City of Camden.

Section III. Evaluation Criteria

1. Demonstration of Need: Describe the need for project and how the activities would support eligible projects under Chapter 53 of Title 49 (4,000 Characters)

This application is responsive to a demonstrated need.

This project addresses need that has been specifically identified by our regional MPO for one of the "Core Cities" in the region. "Core Cities in the region include Philadelphia, Trenton, Camden, and Chester. These cities serve as critical employment, cultural, commercial, and educational centers of the region. Targeted infrastructure investment, maintenance and rehabilitation, and comprehensive neighborhood revitalization can help to revitalize the region's cities and reinforce them as engines of economic growth." (Connection 2050, p.58)

This application represents an investment that would support and amplify the impact of a TIP funded project. *Connections 2050* identifies major improvement projects that are fully funded in the TIP or have been selected to receive funding in the later years. PATCO bridge and station improvements in Camden are on that list, slated for 2022-2031. Additionally, the improvements to the Walter Rand Transportation Center were funded by the State of NJ at \$250 million, with an initial projected planning phase of nine months.

This project in particular works to bridge a specific and key institutional gap between the mission of a Parking Authority and the mission of transit planners in a City where the Parking Authority owns key real estate assets. This project will commit the PACC to collaborate with transit planners, diverting its resources and planning from the traditional mixed use parking garage development route toward providing a resource that aligns with the larger vision for mobility and community access to transit options.

The proposed project will engage Camden residents in a comprehensive, community-focused, planning process that will help to ensure that future investments in Camden's Waterfront and Downtown are fully responsive to not only commuters and visitors, but residents as well. As investments in the redevelopment of Camden have increased, so have calls for collaboration and engagement, but funding for those aspects of the planning process have been difficult to secure. With APP funds, the City and the Parking Authority can partner to bring the planning process to the people, democratizing redevelopment for the good of all stakeholders.

This application supports an eligible project under Chapter 53 of Title 49.

This application is fully aligned with the project eligibility criteria outlined in Chapter 53 of Title 49. Section 5301 (a) of Chapter 53 of Title 49 states: "It is in the interest of the United States, including the economic interest of the United States, to foster the development and revitalization of public transportation systems with the cooperation of both public transportation companies and private companies engaged in public transportation." This application is specifically focused on achieving these goals.

This project will work to achieve important benefits by integrating community creativity and feedback into every aspect of the planning process.

This application proposes activities that will address the following factors:

Existing System Condition

This project will encourage improved system condition by building upon the success of the planned Walter Rand Transportation Center at a variety of locations across Downtown Camden.

Enhanced Access and Mobility

This project will be designed to be 100% accessible and ADA compliant. This project will provide safe transportation alternatives for Camden residents by offering greater ease of navigation between Camden's poorest neighborhoods to the waterfront area and regional job centers and bypassing the heavy traffic of US Routes 30 and 130 and I-676. The project will integrate with the City of Camden's first Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan, which is a separate effort that is being undertaken by the city and the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) throughout 2021. It will also work to better link riders to the job opportunities in the region by maximizing access to the planned Walter Rand Transportation Center and create better access for Camden's poorest residents to the multi-use Circuit Trail network in Philadelphia via the Ben Franklin Bridge.

Innovative Technologies

This project will support innovative technologies, including possible EV charging, rideshare technologies, and planning for maximizing the benefits of driverless vehicle technologies to Camden City residents.

Vehicle Emissions Reductions

This project will result in a higher usage rate of shared transit and non-vehicular transport, reducing personal vehicle usage.

Barriers to Low Income Housing

Redevelopment efforts geared toward visitors and commuters often increase the cost of housing in the targeted areas. Project leadership understands that transit-oriented development must incorporate the needs of low-income housing residents to produce equitable outcomes for the City. This project is specifically designed to increase transit choice and access for Camden's poorest residents, who have been traditionally left out of redevelopment planning.

Regional and Local Support

This project includes a robust community engagement process that will use evidencebased practices, led by an experienced transit planner, to design the scope of the project based upon the needs and desires of transit users. It also draws on the trust Camden residents have in chosen partners, such as community leader Wasim Muhammad.

The City of Camden has deep technical capacity and close working relationships with regional transit planning organizations including the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission, the Delaware River Port Authority and the State of NJ Department of Transportation. The grants administration team has deep expertise in overseeing complex projects, representing sufficient technical capacity for execution of this project.

The Parking Authority of the City of Camden (PACC) is the owner, operator and designated developer of key real estate assets targeted by the planning process herein described. The PACC will function as a subgrantee to the City of Camden, and Project Owner of the proposed project. The Authority was established by ordinance of the Council of the City of Camden and is charged with the operation of parking garages, parking lots and the meters throughout the City. The Authority currently operates twenty-two (22) surface lots and two (2) garage facilities and collects revenues from approximately 863 parking meters. The Authority manages daily and special event parking for the BB&T center, Battleship New Jersey, Rutgers University, the Adventure Aquarium and holiday fireworks displays. The City believes that these are essential governmental functions and that the Authority, operating independently, can perform them efficiently and effectively.

Matching funds will be provided from the PACC. These funds will be secured upon project approval, as the financial viability of the project depends upon these grant funds. A Phase I deliverable is the production of the necessary market analysis and a predevelopment financial feasibility report, which will outline the financial constraints around the project, identifying the number of fee for service components necessary. Once the grant is awarded, PACC will allocate the matching funds required. Sources for these funds may include a combination of cash on hand, bond debt issuance, and future revenue from the project. Camden Community Partnership (CCP): Joseph Myers, COO of Camden Community Partnership, will contribute real estate consulting expertise and community engagement strategy to the project. CCP has been active in Camden since 1984 and has been at the forefront of planning and development in Camden.

Gateway Progressive Land Development: This project hinges upon the involvement of Minister Wasim Muhammad, current Camden School Board President, Executive Director of Gateway Progressive Land Development, and local religious and educational leader. His investment in the project will garner public trust, and that trust will increase engagement and improve the results of any collaborative planning that occurs, including focus groups, surveys, and public comment periods.

Workplan:

Phase I - Project Planning will include community engagement and financial planning. During Phase I, the project program will be conceptualized via a community engagement process. A significant amount of time and resources are to be allocated to this phase so that Camden City residents have full involvement in determining the outcome of the project. Care will be taken to recruit community participants who have diverse experiences with the transit system. We will work with the Camden School District to facilitate discussions with youth that utilize public transit for school commuting. Camden Community Partnership will work with Gateway Progressive and a professional transit planner to design and lead this process, which will include a minimum of (3) focus groups / charrettes. The resultant project scope will identify a Parking Authority property and a scope of work for a new facility that will achieve mobility goals. This project will identify the best ways to create greater ease of navigation between Camden's poorest neighborhoods to the waterfront area and regional job centers and bypass the heavy traffic of US Routes 30 and 130 and 1-676. The project will integrate with the City of Camden's first Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. which is a separate effort that is being undertaken by the city and the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) throughout 2021. It will also work to better link riders to the job opportunities in the region by maximizing access to the planned Walter Rand Transportation Center and create better access for Camden's poorest residents to the multi-use Circuit Trail network in Philadelphia via the Ben Franklin Bridge. The final project scope may include a multimodal facility with a bus terminal, bike-share station, rideshare/vanpool stations, electric vehicle charging stations, and/or accommodation for automated vehicles used for rideshare/vanpool.

PHASE II: Financial Planning & Engineering Planning is composed of a financial planning study and an engineering planning study to confirm the feasibility of the scope of work determined in Phase I.

Camden Community Partnerships will be responsible for the financial planning. They will identify total project cost, proposed project income, cost gaps, tax credits and other funding streams that can be leveraged alongside bond debt issuance and traditional financing.

The engineering study will include preliminary site analysis and site work will be completed, along with the core engineering and architectural work that will result in the project schematics. The community engagement process will continue.

PHASE III: Architecture + Engineering Design Development will see the completion of the engineering planning study, incorporating a finalized mobility study, MEP engineering, and other requisite disciplines. Community engagement and transit planners attending design meetings will continue.

PHASE IV: Construction Documentation. Construction documents, cost estimation, and bidding documents will be produced. Community engagement activities will continue. No FTA grant funds are requested to support Phase IV.

 Technical, Legal, and Financial Capacity: Describe the technical, legal, and financial capacity of the applicant to undertake the project and describe any outstanding legal, technical or financial compliance issues from an FTA compliance review or Federal Transit grant-related Single Audit Finding and the status of work to address them.

TEA-21 stipulates that the Secretary of Transportation must make a number of determinations before a grant or loan can be made for the construction of a transit new start project. The proposed project will generate that credible information. In addition, the current FTA/FHWA metropolitan planning regulations (23 CFR Part 450) require that a corridor for subarea study be conducted on major corridor level transportation problems to consider and evaluate multimodal alternatives as part of the transportation planning and decision making process. Planning issues include proactive community involvement, analysis and evaluation of multimodal alternatives and strategies, estimation of costs, design and analysis of alternative land use policies and development strategies, consideration of environmental justice and social equity impacts and introduction of innovative financing initiatives.

The City of Camden will support the FTA in review and oversight of project level planning analyses, environmental review processes, and project development documentation. These reviews will be based on best professional practices as well as

adherence to appropriate provisions of TEA-21, the metropolitan planning regulations, the environmental regulations, the new start regulations and other programs.





SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CAMDEN, THE CAMDEN COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY, AND THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN

This Shared Services Agreement ("Agreement"), entered into on November 1, 2018, is formed pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. and entered into between the City of Camden, with its principal offices located at 520 Market Street, 4th Floor, Camden, New Jersey ("City"), the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, with its principal offices located at 1645 Ferry Avenue, Camden, New Jersey ("CCMUA"), and the County of Camden, with its principal offices located at 520 Market Street, Suite 306, Camden, New Jersey ("County"). The City, the CCMUA, and the County are hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, in November 2015, the City and the CCMUA entered into a Shared Services Agreement ("2015 Agreement"), in connection with the Camden PowerCorps Program, in order to provide for the maintenance of over 53 green infrastructure installations including 20 rain gardens, 10 City and County parks, 400 vacant lots, and 5500 storm water inlets located within the City, in order to foster environmental stewardship and economic opportunity for the City's youth;

WHEREAS, the 2015 Agreement shall expire on October 31, 2018;

WHEREAS, the City has received a three (3) year grant from the Corporation for National and Community Service, in connection with the Camden PowerCorps Program, as set forth in the City's December 12, 2017 Grant Application to the Corporation for National and Community Services ("Agency") and the September 18, 2018 Grant Transfer Agreement between the City, the Center for Family Services, and the Agency ("Grant Transfer Agreement");

WHEREAS, the City's December 12, 2017 Grant Application and the Grant Transfer Agreement dated September 18, 2018 are attached hereto as Exhibit A and Exhibit B, respectively, and incorporated by reference into this Agreement as though set forth fully herein at length;

WHEREAS, the City and the CCMUA have expressed a mutual desire to enter into this Agreement to provide for the continued maintenance of the aforementioned rain gardens, parks, lots, and storm water inlets; and

WHEREAS, the County has agreed to be a Party to this Agreement, in accordance with the terms, obligations, and consideration set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in exchange for the mutual promises set forth below, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties hereby acknowledge and agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. <u>TERM.</u> This Agreement shall commence on November 1, 2018 and shall expire on October 31, 2021. Each "Contract Year" of this Agreement shall commence on November 1 and expire on October 31 of the subsequent year. For example, the first Contract Year shall begin on November 1, 2018 and shall expire on October 31, 2019.

2. <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES.</u>

a. The City will assign staff and members of the Center for Family Services ("CFS") to the CCMUA and the County. The CFS staff and members shall perform services on behalf of the City, the CCMUA, and the County, which shall include the maintenance of parks, rain gardens, vacant lots, and storm inlets within the City, including the removal of trash, debris, and sediment ("CFS Maintenance Services").

- b. CFS, as the City's designee, will be responsible for the recruitment of its staff and members, the payment of staff salary and member stipends in connection with the CFS Member Services. The City will obtain copies of applicable certificates of insurance from CFS and, upon request, will provide copies of the certificates of insurance to the CCMUA and the County.
- c. The City will ensure that all records pertaining to the CFS Maintenance Services shall be exchanged among all Parties to this Agreement.
- d. The Parties agree to provide CFS with required access to all rain gardens, parks, lots, and storm inlets that are subject to the CFS Maintenance Services.
- e. The CCMUA and the County will provide required training to the CFS members assigned by the City and/or CFS, in connection with the CFS Maintenance Services.
- f. The CCMUA and the County will provide scheduling coordination among the Parties, CFS, and any other individuals or entities, as required, which shall include a scope of work for the CMS Maintenance Services. The scope of work for the CMS Maintenance Services, including the description, frequency, and location(s) of the services, shall be subject to the approval of all Parties to the Agreement, prior to the commencement of any CMS Maintenance Services under this Agreement.

3. CONTRIBUTION OF FUNDS.

a. The CCMUA shall cause an Annual Fee to be paid directly to CFS, as the City's designee, in the amount of One-Hundred and Ninety-Thousand Dollars (\$190,000) for each Contract Year of this Agreement, which shall constitute payment for the CFS Maintenance Services provided by CFS to the CCMUA. The CCMUA's monthly payments to CFS shall be contingent upon the availability and appropriation of sufficient funds for each Contract Year during which this Agreement is in effect. The CCMUA shall make said payments

on a pro-rated monthly basis, upon its receipt of a completed invoice from CFS, setting forth the costs of the CFS Maintenance Services provided by CFS to the CCMUA during the preceding month. All payments made by the CCMUA to CFS pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the CCMUA Board of Commissioners.

- b. The County shall cause an Annual Fee to be paid directly to CFS, as the City's designee, in the amount of Seventy-Three Thousand Dollars (\$73,000) for each Contract Year of this Agreement, which shall constitute payment for the CFS Maintenance Services provided by CFS to the County. The County's monthly payments to CFS shall be contingent upon the availability and appropriation of sufficient funds for each Contract Year during which this Agreement is in effect. The County shall make said payments on a pro-rated monthly basis, upon its receipt of a completed invoice from CFS, setting forth the costs of the CFS Maintenance Services provided by CFS to the County during the preceding month. All payments made by the County to CFS pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the County Board of Chosen Freeholders.
- c. The City shall cause an Annual Fee to be paid directly to CFS, in the amount of One-Hundred and Seventeen-Thousand Dollars (\$117,000) for each Contract Year of this Agreement, which shall constitute payment for the CFS Maintenance Services provided by CFS to the City pursuant to this Agreement. The City's monthly payments to CFS shall be contingent upon the availability and appropriation of sufficient funds for each Contract Year during which this Agreement is in effect. The City shall make said payments on a pro-rated monthly basis, upon its receipt of a completed invoice from CFS, setting forth the costs of the CFS Maintenance Services provided by CFS to the City during the preceding month. All

payments made by the City to CFS pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Camden City Council.

- 4. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH THE LOCAL PUBLIC CONTRACTS LAW.</u> If any Party performing a service on behalf of another Party or the Parties, collectively, to this Agreement, utilizes the services of a private contractor to perform all or most of such service, or all or most of a specific and separate portion of the services so contracted for, such Party shall be required to award the contract for the services to be performed in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.).
- 5. <u>AUDIT.</u> Pursuant to the Single Audit Act of 1984, CFS, as the City's designee, agrees to permit the Parties and/or their agents to examine any and all records relevant to this Agreement and shall make the same available upon demand at a reasonable time and place for the purpose of auditing the records, reports and documents relative to this Agreement.
- 6. RIGHT TO INSPECT. The City, the CCMUA, and the County shall permit CFS or its authorized representative(s) to make visits to the site or sites that are subject to the CFS Maintenance Services, at a mutually convenient time agreed upon by CFS and the Parties, for the purpose of assuring compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

7. <u>INDEMNIFICATION.</u>

a. The City shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the CCMUA and the County, including their respective contractors and/or subcontractors, from and against any and all losses, costs (including litigation costs and counsel fees), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses, which shall arise wholly or in part from the City's and/or CFS's negligent act(s) or omission(s) made in connection with the performance of their respective obligations under this Agreement.

- b. The City shall cause CFS to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the CCMUA and the County, including their respective contractors and/or subcontractors, from and against any and all losses, costs (including litigation costs and counsel fees), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses, which shall arise wholly or in part from the City's and/or CFS's negligent act(s) or omission(s) made in connection with the performance of their respective obligations under this Agreement.
- c. The CCMUA shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, CFS, and the County, including their respective contractors and subcontractors, from and against any and all losses, costs (including litigation costs and counsel fees), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses, which shall arise wholly or in part from the CCMUA's negligent act(s) or omission(s) made in connection with the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- d. The County shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, CFS, and the CCMUA, including their respective contractors and subcontractors, from and against any and all losses, costs (including litigation costs and counsel fees), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses, including, but not limited to, which shall arise wholly or in part from the County's negligent act(s) or omission(s) made in connection with the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- 8. GOVERNING LAW AND CONSTRUCTION. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey. Any disputes arising out of and/or relating to this Agreement shall be filed only in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Camden County, or the District Court for the District of New Jersey, Camden Vicinage, and the Parties consent to personal jurisdiction in such courts for any such actions.

- 9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND HEADINGS. This Agreement embodies the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings related to the subject matters hereof, including the 2015 Agreement. The headings in this Agreement are for purposes of reference only and shall not limit or otherwise affect the meaning of this Agreement or its provisions.
- 10. MODIFICATIONS AND AMENDMENTS. This Agreement shall not be modified or amended except by writing duly executed and signed by the Parties to this Agreement.
- 11. ASSIGNMENT. The Parties may not assign or delegate their rights or obligations under this Agreement to any other person and this Agreement shall be binding on the heirs, executors and beneficiaries and any successor organization by merger, change of control or operation of law.
- 12. PROVISIONS. In the event that any provision of this Agreement is deemed invalid, illegal, void, or unenforceable, such provision shall be regarded as stricken from this Agreement and will not affect the validity or enforceability of the remainder of this Agreement unless the absence of the provision materially alters the rights and obligations of the signatories under this Agreement.
- 13. NO WAIVER. Except as otherwise expressly stated in this Agreement, no failure on the part of any Party to this Agreement to exercise and no delay in exercising any right, power or remedy under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, power or remedy under this Agreement preclude any other or further exercise of any right, power or remedy.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 803 (VEHICLES, ABANDONED) OF THE CITY CODE

WHEREAS, the City Council understands that Chapter 803 (Vehicles, Abandoned) currently regulates the impoundment, disposition, reclamation, and scrapping of vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden understands that Chapter 803 needs to be further amended to facilitate the City of Camden's efficient impoundment, disposition, reclamation, and scrapping of vehicles, under said Chapter, all in compliance with current state law governing the same; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden seeks to amend this Chapter to permit both the Parking Authority of the City of Camden and the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, to oversee the ticketing and towing, as necessary, of illegally parked or abandoned vehicles in the City of Camden and on behalf of the City of Camden; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Camden that Chapter 803, Sections 1 through 12 are hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 803: VEHICLES, ABANDONED

§ 803-1 Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles created.

- A. On behalf of the City of Camden, there shall be created a Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles within the Department of Administration.
- B. The head of the Bureau shall be the Business Administrator or his designee.
- C. The powers of the Bureau may be performed by the Business Administrator or employees of the Department of Administration designated by the Business Administrator or by officials of the Parking Authority, or by officials of the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division or an agent or agents acting under a contract approved by the City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division. Authorized officials of said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, shall be vested with the authority to enforce any and all ordinances providing for ticketing of illegally parked or abandoned vehicles and said Bureau, the Parking Authority and the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts, shall also be vested with the authority to enforce any and all ordinances providing for towing, immobilizing and impounding of abandoned and unclaimed vehicles and the collection of all fees and fines therein.

§ 803-2 Identification of abandoned vehicles; impoundment.

Any motor vehicle which is unclaimed and/or abandoned within the City of Camden is hereby declared to be a nuisance and the same may be summarily abated by the removal thereof and impoundment thereof, as follows:

A. Upon discovery of a vehicle suspected of being unclaimed or abandoned by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, a sticker, stating that this vehicle shall be deemed to be abandoned and unclaimed if not removed within 48 hours, shall be affixed to such vehicle by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, unless an authorized official from said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division determines that immediate towing is necessary.

- B. Upon discovery of a motor vehicle found unclaimed and abandoned by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, the taking of possession shall be reported immediately to the Director of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 on a form prescribed by said Director for verification of ownership.
- C. Upon discovery of a motor vehicle suspected to be unclaimed and abandoned by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, and prior to taking possession of said motor vehicle, an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall confirm whether the motor vehicle is to be considered stolen. If, after the allotted time as outlined in § 803-2A has expired, the owner of said vehicle has not voluntarily removed said vehicle, said vehicle may be removed under the direction or at the request of any authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, by means of towing or otherwise to a storage lot as designated by said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division. Upon the removal of a vehicle to a storage lot, said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall institute the notice requirements of N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1.

§ 803-3 Sale of vehicles and property remaining unclaimed.

- A. When an impounded motor vehicle shall have remained unclaimed by the owner or other person having legal right thereof for the period of time as provided for in N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1, the same may be sold at auction in a public place or otherwise disposed of, as provided for in N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 and this Chapter. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, shall give notice of such sale or other disposition of the vehicle which shall be made in conformity with N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1, describing said vehicle with reasonable clarity by manufacturer's trade name or make, motor number and license number and stating therein the name of any owner or any holder of a security interest, if known. Furthermore, all sales or other dispositions of vehicles shall be made in conformity with N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 and this Chapter.
- B. Any tangible personal property found within said vehicle shall be turned over to the said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, for disposition of sale pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-157.

§ 803-4 Use of proceeds from sale.

Any proceeds obtained from the sale of a vehicle at public auction or other disposition of a vehicle in excess of the amount owed to said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts for the costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicle, and any fines, penalties and court costs assessed against the owner of the vehicle for a violation that gave rise to the impoundment or immobilization of the vehicle and any outstanding warrants against the motor vehicle shall be returned to the owner of the vehicle if his address and name are known. Otherwise, the proceeds of the sale or other disposition in excess of the amount owed to said Bureau, the Parking Authority, or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, shall be retained by the said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division.

- A. The owner of the vehicle is also responsible for any fine or penalty or court costs assessed against him for rendering such vehicle as unclaimed and abandoned.
- B. Any fines, penalties and charges derived herein shall be paid to said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division.

\S 803-5 Vehicles with Outstanding Warrants or Unpaid Parking Tickets.

- A. Vehicles located within the City of Camden which are identified as having outstanding warrants or three (3) or more delinquent traffic or parking tickets shall be subject to Chapter 815 of the City of Camden Code.
- B. Any tangible personal property found within said motor vehicle shall be turned over to said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division as agreed to by said Bureau, the Parking Authority and/or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division for disposition of sale pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-157.

§ 803-6 Reclaiming of impounded vehicles upon payment of costs.

At any time prior to the sale, the owner of the motor vehicle or other person entitled to the motor vehicle may reclaim possession of the motor vehicle upon payment of the costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicle. Additionally, the fines, penalties and court costs assessed against the owner or other person entitled to the motor vehicle which gave rise to the removal and impoundment thereof must also be paid.

§ 803-7 Reclamation costs.

- A. The reclamation costs for the towing, impoundment and storage of the vehicle, if performed directly by the city or its employees, are as follows:
 - (1) For a vehicle placed at a City storage lot, storage fees for that vehicle shall be:

For vehicles which are towed by private contractor(s) who have been awarded contract(s) as the result of public bidding by the City, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division and are stored at the private contractor's storage facility, then the reclamation costs shall be those provided for in the contract between the City, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division and the private contractor(s).

§ 803-8 Junk title for old vehicles.

When any towed vehicle has been determined by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, to be eligible for junk title as defined by N.J.S.A. 39:10A-3, junk title may be sought from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission and the vehicle shall be sold or otherwise disposed of and such sale or other disposition of the vehicle shall be made in conformity with N.J.S.A. 39:10A-1 and this Chapter.

§ 803-9 Scrap vehicles.

A. Whenever any abandoned or unclaimed motor vehicle has been so deteriorated, damaged or stripped of useable parts as to be rendered to scrap and thus no longer a motor vehicle, an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division are authorized to certify the same as motor vehicle scrap. Such motor vehicle scrap may be sold or otherwise disposed of and removed to a scrap processing company or junk dealer. Said disposition shall be accomplished without the need for title papers, certificate of ownership, junk title certificate or any further

certification or verification from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission or notification to the owner thereof of advertisement of sale.

- B. No such motor vehicle scrap shall be removed from private property by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division. Any vehicle identified as scrap pursuant to §803-9A, shall not be sold or otherwise disposed for a period of twenty (20) business days and the sale or other disposition of the vehicle is to be made in accordance with state statutes and this Chapter.
- C. Upon disposition of motor vehicle scrap thereof by an authorized official of said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, the vehicle identification number thereof and any motor vehicle registration plate attached thereto shall be turned into the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, destroyed or obliterated. The certificate as motor vehicle scrap shall include a picture thereof and shall be made on such form and in such detail as prescribed by the Director of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall keep, as a public record, the name and address of the purchaser or recipient of said motor vehicle scrap and the terms of transfer thereof for a period as prescribed by law.
- D. For all All-Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) or other similar types of off-road vehicles, which are towed to and stored by said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts, this section shall apply. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall promptly notify the owner and any known holder of a security interest that the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle is being stored on a contractor's lot. If the owner and any known holder of a security interest of the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle fails to respond to the notice within thirty (30) days, the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle, may be sold at public auction or otherwise disposed of as scrap and removed to a scrap processing company or junk dealer Notice of the sale or other disposition of the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle, shall be given by certified mail, to the owner, if his name and address be known, and any known holder of a security interest, and by publication in one or more newspapers published in this state and circulating in the city, at least five days before the date of the sale or other disposition. Said disposition shall be accomplished without the need for title papers, certificate of ownership, junk title certificate or any further certification or verification from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, the Business Administrator or his designee or the Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles.

§ 803-10 Sale of vehicles without title certificates.

Upon the sale of a motor vehicle to a Third Party Purchaser for which standard or junk title cannot be obtained from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts shall provide the purchaser with a bill of sale or other similar document indicating the purchase made by the Third Party Purchaser.

§ 803-11 Liability of City for vehicles sold.

The City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, upon sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, give no warranties or guaranties of any nature whatsoever. Furthermore, upon the sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, all claims of interest therein shall be forever barred as provided by the laws of the State of New Jersey, and the City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, sells, or for other disposition, otherwise gives up all right, title and interest which they may have in said motor vehicle and is released from any liability concerning said sale or other disposition or said taking. Upon the sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, such liability shall be the responsibility of the purchaser or the recipient.

§ 803-12 Other penalties allowed.

The impounding or immobilizing of a motor vehicle shall not preclude or prevent the institution of prosecution for any criminal or any other violation of a city ordinance or state statute in any court of this state, including the Municipal Court, against the owner or operator of such impounded or immobilized vehicle.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any portion of the City Code not herein amended and supplemented shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

Additionally, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the State Commissioner of Community Affairs, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to veto this Ordinance, and the action by the Commissioner regarding this Ordinance shall supersede any action by the Mayor on the same Ordinance. All notices of approval and/or veto shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 803 (VEHICLES, ABANDONED) OF THE CITY CODE

WHEREAS, the City Council understands that Chapter 803 (Vehicles, Abandoned) currently regulates the impoundment, disposition, reclamation, and scrapping of vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden understands that Chapter 803 needs to be further amended to facilitate the City of Camden's efficient impoundment, disposition, reclamation, and scrapping of vehicles, under said Chapter, all in compliance with current state law governing the same and

WHEREAS, the City of Camden seeks to amend this Chapter to permit both the Parking Authority of the City of Camden and the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, to oversee the ticketing and towing, as necessary, of illegally parked or abandoned vehicles in the City of Camden and on behalf of the City of Camden; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Camden that Chapter 803, Sections 1 through 12 are hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 548: VEHICLES, ABANDONED

§ 803-1 Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles created.

- A. On behalf of the City of Camden, there shall be created a Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles within the Department of Administration.
- B. The head of the Bureau shall be the Business Administrator or his designee.
- C. Said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division shall promptly notify the owner and any known holder of a security interest that the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle is being stored on a contractor's lot. If the owner and any known holder of a security interest of the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle fails to respond to the notice within thirty (30) days, the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle, may be sold at public auction or otherwise disposed of as scrap and removed to a scrap processing company or junk dealer Notice of the sale or other disposition of the ATV or other similar type of off-road vehicle, shall be given by certified mail, to the owner, if his name and address be known, and any known holder of a security interest, and by publication in one or more newspapers published in this state and circulating in the city, at least five days before the date of the sale or other disposition. Said disposition shall be accomplished without the need for title papers, certificate of ownership, junk title certificate or any further certification or verification from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, the Business Administrator or his designee or the Bureau of Abandoned and Unclaimed Vehicles.

§ 803-10 Sale of vehicles without title certificates.

Upon the sale of a motor vehicle to a Third Party Purchaser for which standard or junk title cannot be obtained from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, said Bureau, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or their agents acting under an approved contract or contracts shall provide the purchaser with a bill of sale or other similar document indicating the purchase made by the Third Party Purchaser.

§ 548-11 Liability of City for vehicles sold.

The City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, upon sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, gives no warranties or guaranties of any nature whatsoever. Furthermore, upon the sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, all claims of interest therein shall be forever barred as provided by the laws of the State of New Jersey, and the City of Camden, the Parking Authority or the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, sells, or for other disposition, otherwise gives up all right, title and interest which theyit may have in said motor vehicle and is released from any liability concerning said sale or other disposition or said taking. Upon the sale or other disposition of a motor vehicle pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, such liability shall be the responsibility of the purchaser or the recipient.

§ 548-12 Other penalties allowed.

The impounding or immobilizing of a motor vehicle shall not preclude or prevent the institution of prosecution for any criminal or any other violation of a city ordinance or state statute in any court of this state, including the Municipal Court, against the owner or operator of such impounded or immobilized vehicle.

The City, the Parking Authority, their agents, servants or employees shall not be responsible or liable in any manner for damage incurred in towing, storage, immobilization, possession or disposition of such vehicles.

§ 815-3. Fee. [Amended 12-28-1990 by Ord. No. MC-2612]

In the event that a vehicle is immobilized for unpaid parking violations as provided in § 815-2 of this chapter, an immobilization fee of \$60 shall be assessed.

§ 815-4. Sale of impounded vehicle; notice.

If any outstanding warrants are not paid by 12:00 midnight of the 30th day following the day on which the vehicle was impounded or immobilized, the vehicle may be sold at public auction. The City shall give notice of the sale by certified mail to the owner, if his name is known, and to the holder of any security interest filed with the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles, and by publication in the form prescribed by the Director of Motor Vehicles, by one insertion, at least five days before the date of the sale, in one or more newspapers published in this state and circulating in the City. Vehicles owned by lessors who have complied with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-139.2 et seq. respecting lessors shall not be sold.

§ 815-5. Release upon payment. [Amended 12-28-1990 by Ord. No. MC-2612]

A. At any time prior to the sale, the owner of the motor vehicle or other person entitled to the motor vehicle may reclaim possession of it upon payment of:

- (1) The reasonable costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicle, including a towing charge, not to exceed the amount as specified in any contract between the Parking Authority and its contractor for the towing and storage of said vehicle.
- (2) Any fines imposed by this chapter.
- (3) Any fine or penalty and court costs assessed against the owner of the vehicle for violation(s) which gave rise to the impoundment or immobilization of the vehicle, including any outstanding warrants against such vehicle

B. The owner-lessor of a motor vehicle who has complied with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-139.2 et seq. respecting owners-lessors shall be entitled to reclaim possession without payment and the lessee shall be liable for any fine, penalty, court costs and outstanding warrants against the vehicle.

§ 815-6. Disposition of sale proceeds.

Any proceeds obtained from the sale of the vehicle at public auction in excess of the amount owed to the City, the Parking Authority or an agent or agents acting under a contract approved by the City of Camden or the Parking Authority for the reasonable costs of removal and storage of the motor vehicles and any fines or penalties and court costs assessed against said vehicle for the violation which gave rise to the impoundment

or immobilization of the motor vehicle, including any outstanding warrants against such vehicle, shall be returned to the owner of the vehicle, if his or her name and address are known.

§ 815-7. Prohibited acts.

- A. It shall be unlawful and an offense for any person to impair, render inoperative or cause any person to impair or render inoperative any immobilization device which has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.
- B. It shall be unlawful and an offense for any person to move or cause to be moved any vehicle, wherever immobilized which has been immobilized in accordance with this chapter.

§ 815-8. Violations and penalties. [Amended 10-12-2006 by Ord. No. MC-4234]

Unless otherwise provided in the chapter, penalties against persons violating the provisions of this chapter shall be imposed in accordance with the provisions of § 1-15.

Re: Projected 2022 MEL budget

Attached is the preliminary 2022 budget which projects a 9.9% increase in rates before changes in exposures. The market for excess and reinsurance is increasing at a more rapid pace than at any time since the MEL was created. This is compounded by recent court decisions, legislation, and administrative actions from Trenton that are causing a serious increase in claims.

- Property: \$15,786,823¹ Coverage for fire, flood, and etc. is increasing 17.8% or \$2,385,343 because of the frequency of natural disasters over the past few years. This has caused a serious increase in prices charged by both the national and international property insurance markets.
- Liability: \$15,207,239² Liability claims are increasing at a rate of 5% to 10% per year because of the erosion of Title 59 in New Jersey's courts. The recent amendment in the Sexual Molestation statute of limitations will increase total liability costs by an estimated 6%. In some cases, towns are being hit with lawsuits based on allegations going back 40 years. However, these increases are being offset by the MEL's decision last fall to self-insure the \$3 million ex \$2 million layer saving \$1,432,378 (46.2%). As a result, the total liability appropriation is a reduction of \$91,780 (0.6%).
- Workers' Compensation: \$11,820,762³ A recent Department of Labor decision will increase workers' compensation by 11% by directing governmental entities to pay workers' compensation on many accidental disability claims that were paid by the pension plans before the change. This is on top of continuing increases in Worker's Compensation medical costs and indemnity rates. As a result, the MEL's budget for Workers' Compensation is increasing \$1,317,871 (12.5%).
- Cyber: \$2,815,798⁴ Claims and excess premiums are increasing \$1,342,671 (91.1%) in response to increased cyberattacks on municipal government. The MEL Cyber Task

Force is currently studying additional measures to control this cost.

- Other Coverages: \$525,285⁵ The budgets for the Faithful Performance bonds, surety bonds and the aggregate loss fund account are unchanged.
- Loss Fund Contingency: \$216,1266 This is reduced \$368,381 to keep the overall budget increase under 10%.
- Expenses and MEL Safety Institute: 5,407,676⁷ These items are budgeted at a 2% increase and will be reviewed by the MEL Management and Budget Committee before the budget is introduced in October.

Fortunately, the MEL has been able to contain budget increases because several years ago the Commissioners approved an automatic surplus contribution plan that maintains the MEL's surplus in the event claims prove higher than expected. Currently, the MEL and the member JIFs have a combined surplus of almost \$200 million to help smooth increases. This will also allow the MEL to eliminate the retrospective rating plan for the 2022 budget.

The next step is for the Management and Budget Committee to review the draft budget and recommend a budget for introduction at the October 20 meeting.

The date of execution of this agreement is the day of , 2021.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the County of Camden and the City of Camden desires to enter into a Shared Services Agreement to further coordinate with the Camden County One Stop for workforce development and job training for City residents; and

WHEREAS the County of Camden proposes to hire Luis F. Ruiz at the Camden County One Stop for a period of one (1) year at the salary of \$90,000 per year; and

WHEREAS the City of Camden agrees to contribute \$35,000 towards the salary; and

WHEREAS the job duties include workforce development and job training for Camden City residents; and

SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND THE CITY OF CAMDEN

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WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the County of Camden and the City of Camden desires to enter into a Shared Services Agreement to further coordinate with the Camden County One Stop for workforce development and job training for City residents; and

WHEREAS the County of Camden proposes to hire Luis F. Ruiz at the Camden County One Stop for a period of one (1) year at the salary of \$90,000 per year; and

WHEREAS the City of Camden agrees to contribute \$35,000 towards the salary; and

WHEREAS the job duties include workforce development and job training for Camden City residents; and

WHEREAS N.J.S.A. 40A:65-I, et seq ("Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act") permits two local units to enter into a contract for any service which any party to the agreement is empowered to render within its jurisdiction: and

WHEREAS the County of Camden and the City of Camden agree that their mutual public purposes and their best interest will be promoted by the execution and delivery of this Shared Services Agreement pursuant to the powers conferred by the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act; now, therefore,

IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

h. Affirmative Action

WHEREAS, the 2015 Agreement was renewed via a second SSA in November 2018 ("2018 Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the CFS has now received a three (3) year grant directly for National and Community Service, in connection with the PowerCorps Program; and

THIS CONTRACT AND AGREEMENT made and entered into this 27th day of Nember in the year of Two Thousand Eighteen (2018).

THE CITY OF CAMDEN, a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, 520 Market Street, Camden, NJ 08101 of the first part, hereinafter referred to as the party of the first part or the "City" and Center for Family Services, 584 Benson Street, Camden, NJ 08103 of the second part, hereinafter referred to as the party of the second part or the "CFS".

WITNESSETH:

The City and CFS have reached an agreement for CFS to operate and serve in the capacity as lead agency by coordinating and managing the Camden PowerCorps Program that will provide professional development, on-the-job training, and support in transitioning to employment, post-secondary education, and/or continued national service for up to three months beyond the six (6) month term of service which can include planting trees, removing invasive plants, restoring trails and streams, and enhancing public spaces to create cleaner, healthier, and safer spaces for all City residents.

Furthermore, this project is to foster environmental stewardship and economic opportunity for Camden City's youth, as set forth in Resolution R-56 approved by the Camden City Council on September 11, 2018, and the mutual promises and covenants of the parties hereto, it is agreed that:

The party of the second part does hereby agree and covenant that it, he or she will, comply with the Labor Laws of the State of New Jersey and of the United States of America as it may pertain to the manufacture, assembly or performance of the goods or services to be supplied hereunder and to further pay to its employees a sum no less than the prevailing daily rate for wages in the locality where the work is to be performed or services rendered pursuant to law.

ARTICLE ONE CONTRACTOR'S SERVICES

1.1 The Contractor shall provide the goods and services as hereinafter set forth and as set forth in the Proposal attached hereto and made a part hereof, within the time limits stated herein and in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and as follows:

1.1.1 Scope of Services

a. CFS will be the lead agency for the grant and, as the City's designee, will be responsible for meeting all grant requirements regarding the disbursement of this grant from the Corporation for National and Community Service including but not limited to reporting to the Corporation for National and Community Service.

- b. CFS, as the City's designee, will be responsible for administering the grant and facilitating the Camden PowerCorps Program that will serve the City of Camden.
- c. CFS, as the City's designee, will be responsible for the recruitment of members, member's stipends, liability associated with members' service (worker's compensation, liability insurance, etc.)
- d. CFS, as the City's designee, will be responsible through the Camden PowerCorps Program to provide Camden PowerCorps members to the City of Camden, American Water, Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and the County of Camden (Which all have separate agreements with the City) that will provide services that include but are not limited to maintenance and clean-up of parks and rain gardens for the City and County Parks within the City of Camden, cleaning out storm drains, street cleaning, and jetting out lines, to name a few.
- e. CFS shall provide to the City, and the agencies receiving services, records and documentation submitted to the Corporation for National and Community Service for services performed at the respective agencies' locations. The agencies shall provide CFS with all records and documents regarding the Camden PowerCorps Program and services provided on their behalf.

ARTICLE TWO SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

2.1 This Agreement shall be in effect for the life of the entire three (3) years term of the Agreement which shall commence October 1, 2018 and end October 31, 2021, the content of which is incorporated by reference as though set forth fully herein at length.

ARTICLE THREE COMPENSATION

- 3.1. The City agrees to pay or cause to be paid by a cash match in an amount not to exceed ONE HUNDRED SEVENTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$117,000.00). The parties acknowledge that the City is subject to the Local Public Contracts Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-15, which states that this contract shall be subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds.
- 3.2. Payment shall be based upon the schedule of fees and costs set forth in the attached Proposal.
 - 3.3. The terms and conditions of payment shall be as follows:

- 3.3.1 All original invoices shall be submitted to the Department of Public Works with a copy to the Division of Purchasing. A monthly invoice setting forth with specificity the actual hours of work performed on specific assignments in accordance with this Agreement and a detailed breakdown of costs and charges; then upon certification by the Department of Public Works that the work was done or articles furnished in a satisfactory manner; then upon presentation by the Contractor to the City Department of Finance the said invoice and Certification in Lieu of Affidavit that the work done or articles furnished are according to this contract and according to law and not upon any secret promises to pay any bonus in money or property as detailed on the invoice.
- 3.3.2. And, it is further agreed by the parties hereto, that in the event of a default by the party of the second part in any of the terms and/or conditions hereof then in such an event, the party of the second part shall forfeit any and all monies which may be due to the party of the second part. The party of the second part shall be liable for the payment of any costs or expenses incurred by the party of the first part in excess of the contract price required to complete this contract.
- 3.3.3. IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that in the event of a default as aforesaid, the party of the second part, its successors, heirs or personal representatives shall pay such excess costs and expenses upon the presentation of an invoice by party of the first part.

ARTICLE FOUR GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

4.1 RECORDS

All collected data shall be provided to the City in Microsoft Excel. CONTRACTOR and any subcontractors shall keep, or cause to be kept accurate records and books of accounts, shall record and report in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures and with all essential details, the receipt and disbursement of all funds under the terms of this Agreement. The CITY shall have access at all reasonable times to all records and books of accounts pertaining to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that any payment made by CITY to CONTRACTOR under the terms and conditions of this agreement is subject to audit. CONTRACTOR shall preserve all documents, records and books of account pertaining to this payment for inspection and/or audit by any authorized representatives of the CITY or its cognizant audit agency. Copies thereof, if requested, shall be furnished to either of the foregoing.

4.2 NO MONEY FOR PARTISAN POLITICAL ACTIVITY

The money provided by the CITY under this Agreement shall not be used for any partisan political activity, for furthering the election or defeat of any candidate for public office, or for any other purpose prohibited by the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501, et seq.).

4.3 PRIOR CONSENT OF CITY FOR DISTRIBUTION OF INFORMATION

No information or material gathered under this Agreement shall be made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the CITY.

4.4 NON-ASSIGNABILITY

CONTRACTOR shall not assign any interest or delegate any duty arising from this Agreement without the prior written consent of the CITY.

4.5 NONDISCRIMINATION AND EQUAL EMPLOYMENT
OPPORTUNITY REQUIREMENT PURSUANT TO
N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. (P.L.1975, c.127) N.J.A.C. 17:27 et seq.

During the performance of this contract, CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

4.6 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

If for any reason, CONTRACTOR fails to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this agreement, or if CONTRACTOR violates any of the conditions, covenants, agreements or stipulations of this agreement, the CITY shall, thereupon, have the right to terminate this agreement by giving written notice to CONTRACTOR of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least thirty days before such date. In that event, all or any part of finished or unfinished materials prepared by CONTRACTOR shall, at the option of the CITY, become its property and CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to just and equitable compensation for the materials accepted by the CITY.

Notwithstanding the above, CONTRACTOR shall not be relieved of liability to the CITY for damages sustained by the CITY by virtue of any breach of this Agreement.

4.7 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE OF THE CITY

The CITY may terminate this agreement at its convenience at any time by giving written notice to CONTRACTOR of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof at least seven days before the effective date of such termination. In that event of termination for the convenience of the CITY, CITY shall pay CONTRACTOR for all hardware, software, and services delivered or performed up to the date of cancellation, and all work in progress that was requested by the City prior to cancellation for which CONTRACTOR has already incurred costs, and for that portion of the actual out of pocket expenses (not otherwise reimbursed under this contract) incurred by CONTRACTOR during the contract period which are directly attributable to the uncompleted portion of the services covered by this contract.

4.8 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

a. No officer, member or employee of the CITY and no member of its governing body and no other public official of the governing body of the locality or localities in which the project is situated or being carried out who exercises any function or responsibilities in the review or approval in the undertaking or carrying out of this project shall participate in any decision relating to this contract which affects his personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which it is, directly or indirectly, interested or have any personal pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the proceeds thereof.

- b. CONTRACTOR covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required under this contract. CONTRACTOR further covenants that in the performance of this contract no person having any such interest shall be employed.
- c. No members of or delegates to the Congress of the United States and no Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit arising from it.

4.9 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND LOCAL LAWS

CONTRACTOR shall fulfill all requirements imposed by the Federal government on expenditures, grants and other uses of money derived by the CITY from the Federal government. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and codes of the State of New Jersey and the City of Camden.

4.10 CHANGES

The CITY may from time to time request changes in the Scope of Services of the CONTRACTOR to be performed under this Agreement.

Such changes, including any decrease or increase in the amount of the CONTRACTOR'S compensation, which are mutually agreed upon between the CITY and the CONTRACTOR, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Agreement.

4.11 INDEMNIFICATION

CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City from and against any and all losses, costs (including litigation costs and counsel fees), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses brought by any third party alleging loss of life, bodily and personal injury, or damage to property, occasioned wholly or in part by Contractor's intentional, reckless or negligent acts or omissions, or the intentional, reckless or negligent acts or omissions of Contractor's agents, sub-consultants, employees or servants in conjunction with Contractor's performance of services under this Agreement.

4.12 ENTIRE UNDERSTANDING

This written Agreement, including the Maintenance Agreement and its Schedules, represents the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

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Executive Summary

The State of New Jersey seeks to partner with the City of Camden to launch Camden PowerCorps, a program that will deploy 30 AmeriCorps members to maintain parks, stormwater inlets, and other green infrastructure projects in Camden City. During the three-year program period, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for maintaining over 53 green infrastructure installations including 20 rain gardens, 10 city and county parks, 400 vacant lots, and 5500 stormwater inlets that comprise Camden City's network. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 400 volunteers who will be engaged in environmental projects throughout the city including cleaning our waterways, planting trees, and helping to maintain and beautify Camden City. The State and City will partner with: Center for Family Services, based on their considerable national service expertise and leadership in youth development; Cooper's Ferry Partnership, based on their expertise in coordinating Camden's citywide environmental collaborative; and the CamdenCounty Municipal Utilities Authority, a national leader in green infrastructure development.

This program will focus on the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) focus areas of environmental stewardship and economic opportunity. The three-year CNCS investment of \$402,900.00 per year for three years will be matched with an additional \$537,373.00 per year for three years from Camden City, the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, Center For Family Services, and the Camden County Parks Department.

Rationale and Approach/Program Design

PROBLEM/NEED

Camden PowerCorps, Governor Chris Christie and Mayor Dana L. Redd's signature AmeriCorps initiative, proposes to address two priority needs that are shared by the State of New Jersey and the City of Camden. The first is aligned with the CNCS Environmental Stewardship Focus Area and the second falls within the CNCS Economic Opportunity Focus Area. Below is an overview of the problem including a clear description on how Camden PowerCorps will address this problem.

Environmental Stewardship Need

While issues of crime, poverty, education, and vacant and contaminated land continue to remain on the forefront, water quality and stormwater management have emerged as a complex and cutting edge issue in the City of Camden. Stormwater pollution, flood control, water shortages, severe

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weather, and the availability of natural green space have all become pressing environmental issues for cities around the nation, including Camden City. Whether it is localized flooding, costly infrastructure upgrades, or insufficient capacity, stormwater management concerns not only affect the city's environmental quality, but also our long-term quality of life and development potential. And in Camden City, when it rains—it pours! A one-inch rainstorm leaves some major roads impassable, turns lots into stagnant lakes, and sends sewage into the streets, homes, and waterways. The unseasonably wet summer of 2013 created several large street floods that shut down public transportation and cut off roads, stranding residents, workers, and visitors. A fire company's boat was needed to rescue passengers from train platforms surrounded by floodwaters. Additionally, the increase in severe weather events, like Superstorm Sandy in 2012, further threatens Camden City.

Camden City is one of 24 communities in New Jersey that have combined sewer systems designed to carry sanitary sewage at all times and, additionally, stormwater runoff during rainfall events. Over the years, increases in sanitary and stormwater flows have placed tremendous pressures on the City's aging and under-maintained sewer infrastructure. When the capacity of the system is exceeded during rainfall events, wastewater flows are not only discharged into nearby waterways, but also surges through manhole covers into Camden City's streets and open spaces and back up into private homes and businesses. These events impact not only the city's environmental quality but also the long-term quality of life for residents. Due to a substantial capital investment deficit, the City lacks the resources to systematically inventory, assess, maintain, and upgrade the existing conditions of the system, thereby requiring a more comprehensive, forward-thinking and economical approach to stormwater management. Since 2011, various public and private organizations in Camden City banded together to tackle the severe stormwater management issues faced by Camden City. This group, known as Camden SMART (Stormwater Management and Resource Training) is specifically tasked with constructing green infrastructure projects throughout the city to mitigate the regular severe flooding episodes. Unfortunately, while the group has accomplished amazing feats with over \$5 million of green infrastructure projects constructed, there is no funding for maintenance capacity to support the improvements being constructed.

Further, Camden City is without a traditional municipal Parks Department so much of the maintenance for the green infrastructure and park projects is managed by local, active community groups, non-profits, or the Camden County Parks Department. The existing network of maintenance

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providers is a great foundation, but there is still more work to be done. AmeriCorps members will increase the City's capacity to maintain all of the vital green infrastructure projects throughout Camden City. Similar in design to the 21st Century Service Corps, AmeriCorps members will work to protect, restore, and enhance Camden City's public parks and green infrastructure projects. Whether a park cleanup or regular stormwater inlet cleanings, the work of Camden PowerCorps will directly impact Camden City's ability to convey stormwater away from Camden City's houses, businesses, roads, and parks to the Delaware River.

Economic Opportunity Need

Over many years, Camden City has been cited as being among the most poverty-stricken and unsafe cities in the country. Five years ago, Camden was a city whose school system was failing children and families. With violence, poverty, and unemployment on the rise, a sense of despair had permeated the city. However, in the past five years the city has begun to emerge from this sense of hopelessness, through new leadership of the Mayor and County government, which created the opportunity for greater partnership with the State. Working together, we are finding opportunities for partnership in more effective policing, attracting private investment, and greater support for Camden's schools. However, there is much more to be done, particularly for the youth of Camden, many of whom do not now have the education and job skills to succeed in these new opportunity sectors. This is a major reason that the Governor and Mayor have come together to seek national service resources - AmeriCorps members - to address the infrastructure needs of the City and provide training and community service opportunities for young people to ready them for the new Camden that is on the horizon.

The Camden PowerCorps initiative will be a key component of Mayor Redd's office National Forum on Youth Violence Prevention, which is comprised of four research-based strategies: prevention, intervention, reentry, and enforcement. Camden PowerCorps will specifically focus on "opportunity youth" as part of both the prevention and reentry strategies. "Opportunity youth" are young people who are often isolated and disconnected from education and employment pathways to success. Many of these youth are aging out of the child welfare system, reentering from the juvenile justice system, have not completed their high school education, and are facing other challenges. In the summer of 2011, the national unemployment rate of youth 16 to 24 years old was more than 18% or twice the overall unemployment rate; for young African Americans and Hispanics it was 30% and 20%,

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respectively. In Camden City, these statistics are even more dramatic.

In this urban center, 80% of the population is identified as African-American, Hispanic or another ethnic heritage. Over 36% of Camden City residents live below the poverty line, more than double the national average of 15.3%. Moreover, vulnerable populations, including youth (individuals under 25), comprise over 30% of the city's population. Camden City is home to a largely young, poor, and minority population. According to the 2011 U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey, the percentage of people living below the poverty level in Camden City is 42.5%, which is more than double the national average of 15.9%. The City also suffers from high unemployment. Over 30% of Camden City residents are unemployed, which is over three times the national and state unemployment averages. Without a reliable source of employment, many of Camden City's youth turn towards illegal activity to support themselves and their families.

An underlying challenge to the high unemployment rate in Camden City is the lack of job training, education, and life skills that many of Camden City's young residents need to be successful in the workforce. Camden PowerCorps will be a key component of Camden City's strategy to get youth back to work and back on a path to success. It will address the need for high quality opportunities for atrisk "opportunity youth" (ages 18 to 26) to develop the skills required to secure meaningful work and become civically engaged members of society. This approach will not only improve the city's environmental and economic quality, but will train 60 AmeriCorps members annually for 21st century green jobs.

THEORY OF CHANGE

Camden City is faced with a myriad of issues from crime and poverty to aged infrastructure and flooding. With unemployment and poverty rates well over double national averages, Camden City is in great need of economic opportunities for youths ages 18-26, specifically job and life skills training to increase the youths' employability. Parallel to the youth economic crisis, Camden City is faced with significant environmental concerns including an aged infrastructure system that causes frequent flooding episodes that paralyze the city. With Camden locally sitting on a peninsula, stormwater management is critical to the economic success of the city as well as the environmental and public health of the residential neighborhoods. Environmental activity in Camden City is generating outstanding results with the construction of rain gardens, installation of rain barrels, and repairs of

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large parks and infrastructure to convey stormwater. Maintenance of these infrastructure projects becomes the primary concern for policymakers and leaders as they look to the economic and environmental future of Camden City. Additionally, Camden City is without a traditional municipal Parks Department, therefore there is little capacity for citywide green infrastructure and parks maintenance. That is where the AmeriCorps members will be instrumental.

The Theory of Change utilized by Camden PowerCorps first starts with identifying the need for increased environmental stewardship and maintenance, as well as the need for increased economic opportunity for Camden City's disadvantaged youth. Secondly, the City, Center for Family Services, Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and Cooper's Ferry Partnership identified the short, mid-, and long-term outcomes. These outcomes, which are described in detail in the coming narrative, are: 1) Well-maintained Camden City and Camden County Parks and Stormwater Inlets, 2) Clean Parks and Lots: Tons of Materials Collected, 3) Increased Environmental Stewardship, 4) Increase Employability of At-Risk Youth (Re: Training), 5) Increase Employability of At-Risk Youth (Re: Job Placement). Working backwards from the intended outcomes, the program design team identified the intervention, inputs, and activities necessary to reach the intended outcomes. In the case of Camden PowerCorps, inputs included green work sites, equipment (including shovels, hardhats, etc.), uniforms (including AmeriCorps branded clothing, gloves, boots, etc.), transportation, life and jobs skills training curriculum, necessary service partners, number of service members, and target population. The activities and duration of the activities included jobs specifically related to stormwater management, as well as job and life skills training.

Camden PowerCorps: Theory of Change in Detail

Camden PowerCorps is designed as a compilation of specific interventions that are intended to address Camden City's current environmental and economic needs in order to bring about the change needed to reach Camden City's intended outcomes. Evidence-based research, from both local and national sources, informed the specific interventions that comprise the components of the Camden PowerCorps program. As a result of the complex environmental and economic conditions in Camden City, there are multiple intended outcomes from Camden PowerCorps that relate directly to the Corporation for National Community Services' Focus Areas of Environmental Stewardship and Economic Opportunity.

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AmeriCorps members will be recruited from Camden City programs that already serve the target population, disadvantaged youth ages 18-26. Camden PowerCorps will recruit through established recruitment partners including, Center for Family Services, Youthbuild Camden, Work Group, and the Multi-Agency Life Line (M.A.L.L.) Program. The recruitment process is critical to the success of the program. Camden PowerCorps is a rigorous job training and service program and only those ready to take on the daily responsibilities of the program will be recruited. Staff from these four recruitment partners will nominate youth from their individual programs who are most likely to benefit from and succeed in Camden PowerCorps. The youth that attend these four programs represent some of the most at-risk youth in Camden City, all from impoverished and high crime neighborhoods with very little work experience or training. Recruiting from these established partners will help thoroughly screen applicants to ensure the youth are ready for a six-month, full-time, national service term.

For a service term of six months, three teams of 10 AmeriCorps members (total of 60 AmeriCorps members annually) will meet 5 days a week for 8 hours per day. The six-month service term was selected instead of the traditional one-year service term based off of the PowerCorps_PHL program as well as best practices for retention for this population. PowerCorps_PHL found that requiring a one-year commitment from the target population, economically disadvantaged youth, was near impossible as members were unused to making such a long programmatic commitment. Members will be given the option to sign up for a second six-month term, therefore making it a one-year program. For members who elect to complete a second six-month term, the program will not simply be a repeat of their first six months. Second-term members will continue to build on their individual development plan and will have the opportunity for more intensive and higher level placements with our service partners. These placement opportunities will expand the member's expertise, training, and job opportunities upon completion.

Each PowerCorps team will be assigned to one Service Partner: 1) Cooper's Ferry Partnership, 2).

Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, or 3) Camden City. The output of the program is to maintain Camden City's 53 green infrastructure installments, as well as its infrastructure through the cleaning Camden City's stormwater inlets, capturing litter from the city's waterways (including the backchannel of the Delaware River, Cooper River, and Newton Creek), and collecting 2500 tons of trash from 10 city and county parks and 400 vacant lots. The work of the AmeriCorps members is

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critical to prevent flooding and to enhance the long-term quality of life for Camden City residents.

Many of these daily maintenance jobs are located in the neighborhoods where the recruited members live. Members will be trained and encouraged to act as a PowerCorps ambassadors to their community helping to educate 1000 community members on environmental stewardship.

Below, in no particular order, is an overview of the five intended outputs and associated outcomes that will result through the implementation of Camden PowerCorps.

1) Environmental Stewardship: Number of Acres of Camden City and Camden County That Are Improved (EN4, EN 4-1)

Camden City's infrastructure is poorly maintained due to a lack of resources for regular maintenance and upgrades. Nowhere is that more evident than the stormwater management and park system, where a one inch rainfall can flood entire neighborhoods, sending raw sewage water running into the streets, homes, businesses, and parks. Other entities from within Camden dedicated an extraordinary amount of their own resources to overcome the municipal deficiency and construct infrastructure to address storm water management. However, the ongoing maintenance of these large infrastructure projects is a continuing concern. AmeriCorps members will be tasked with the regular maintenance of Camden City's park systems under the guidance of the Camden County Parks Department; the regular cleaning of the City's stormwater inlets supervised by Camden City and the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority; and the ongoing maintenance of over 50 green infrastructure projects within the City supervised by the City of Camden. Maintenance activities will include protecting Camden City's watersheds through stormwater inlet cleaning, reduction in erosion due to stormwater events, and reducing the human impact on the parks and other conserved lands. These outputs and outcomes will be measured through a tracking document that will count how many acres were treated with one or more of the above maintenance activities. In addition, a statement from the City of Camden and the Camden County Parks Department will confirm the positive impact in the condition of the stormwater and parks system in Camden City.

2) Environmental Stewardship: Number of Tons of Materials Collected (EN6, EN6.1)

Illegal dumping is one of the major blights on Camden City Parks and conserved lands. The trash

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dumped either builds up on solid ground making the park unusable or is washed away into the storm inlets and/or the local waterways. In the majority of cases, Camden City's Department of Public Works reports that many illegal dumpers are coming from outside the city, and even outside the state of New Jersey to dump construction debris, household material, and larger appliances. The regular cleanups of the parks, conserved lands, and waterways conducted by AmeriCorps members over the course of a year will result in 2500 tons being extracted, sorted, and delivered to trash and recycling facilities within the city. A regular count of the tons of material captured and the number of tons of material recycled will be tracked throughout the year. Recycled material will be diverted to local recycling facilities or creatively reused onsite. These outputs and outcomes will be measured through an ongoing count of the tonnage of materials collected in the park and the amount diverted to recycling facilities or reused onsite.

3) Environmental Stewardship: Individuals Receiving Education/Training in Environmental Stewardship and/or Environmentally Conscious Practices (EN3, EN3.1, EN3.2)

Residents of Camden City often face environmental and public health hazards, such as the flooding of neighborhoods with raw sewage, without knowing why it happens or how to mitigate these hazards using environmentally conscious practices. AmeriCorps members will be required to participate in an on-going series of in-person educational trainings specific to Camden City's environmental conditions. Learning objectives for each training will range from stormwater management to illegal dumping to recycling to park and open space maintenance. The focus will be on knowledge exchange as well as how to manage behavior in order to live sustainably. The trainings will be targeted to generate two outcomes: 1) increasing the AmeriCorp members' knowledge about environmentally conscious practices, and 2) changing their own behavior to better protect the environment. Additionally, these trainings will educate AmeriCorps members in communicating environmental stewardship to their community, and thereby facilitating a larger, neighborhood-wide behavioral change. These outputs and outcomes will be measured through a count of AmeriCorps members that participate in the trainings, pre- and post-tests to measure change in knowledge, and surveys to assess a change in behavior of the participants. Tests and surveys will be administered and collected within the first year of the grant.

4) Economic Opportunity: Number of Economically Disadvantaged Individuals Receiving Job

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Training and Other Development Services (O2, PowerCorps Determine Outcome)

The target population for PowerCorps is economically disadvantaged youth ages 18-26 from Camden City with little to no traditional work experience. To help improve their employability, at regular intervals throughout their six-month service term, AmeriCorps members will participate in an ongoing series of in-person job and life skills trainings. Job skills training will occur intensively at the beginning of their service term and through daily on-the-job training. The job training will be specifically tailored to the target population. The life skills trainings will focus on soft skills such as, office etiquette, public speaking, financial education, networking, resume writing, and other job search and retention skills. The curriculum for the life skills training courses will be built off the existing Camden County College curriculum that focuses on holistic life skills training. These outputs will be measured through an ongoing count of the number of individuals who completed the entire series of job and life trainings. The outcomes will be measured through knowledge/skills pre- and post-tests for the job skills training as well as a survey that measures behavioral change for the life skills portion of the training.

5) Economic Opportunity: Number of Economically Disadvantaged Individuals Receiving Job Placement Services (03, 010)

As stated above, the target population for PowerCorps is economically disadvantaged youth ages 18-26 from Camden City with little to no traditional work experience. For many, becoming a member of Camden PowerCorps will be their first experience with a traditional work setting (i.e. 40 hours a week for a sustained period of time). AmeriCorps members will regularly meet with the Workforce Development Coordinator who is tasked with providing job search assistance, helping individual members connect with Southern New Jersey firms that specialize in green infrastructure and parks maintenance, and helping to craft resumes/cover letters for jobs and/or post-secondary education opportunities. Increasing the employability will not only benefit the individual AmeriCorps members, but will also improve the economic well being and security of the communities where the AmeriCorps members live. The outputs will be measured through an unduplicated count of AmeriCorps members who utilize these services. These long-term outcomes will be measured through a count of individuals who are hired for a new job, demonstrated through a copy of an acceptance letter from an employer or a copy of a pay stub.

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Each of the above five intended outcomes and associated outputs respond directly to the problem/need identified by Governor Christie and Mayor Redd for improved environmental stewardship and economic opportunity.

EVIDENCE BASE

The PowerCorps model is relatively new to the field of green infrastructure, but there is significant evidence that supports similar models that engage economically disadvantaged youth with significant environmental and economic benefits for the participants and their communities. Camden PowerCorps meets the Moderate Evidence Level with two studies: 1) non-experimental study of a similar program named MillionTreesNYC Training Program, 2) and a non-experimental study conducted on PowerCorps_PHL.

MillionTreesNY C Training Program

The first study, "From job training to green jobs: A case study of young adult employment program centered on environmental restoration in New York City, USA" focused on the MillionTreesNYC Program. Published in the journal of Urban Forestry and Urban Greening in 2013 the study focuses on the socio-psychological, environmental, and economic benefits of engaged economically disadvantaged youth in the development and maintenance of green infrastructure. Similar to Camden PowerCorps, the program focused on the same target population, proposes the same intervention, and seeks the same intended outcomes. Overall, 94% of the interviewees reported gaining knowledge and skills whether physical skills, environmental knowledge, interpersonal skills, and/or office skills. Regarding environmental stewardship, 81% described a positive attitude toward the environment as a result of the program and all respondents stated that their environmental stewardship outside of work increased. Approximately 64% of the individuals who finished the program were placed in, and were able to retain, jobs. The study concludes by stating, "green jobs training and employment presents real opportunities for intellectual stimulation, socio-psychological benefits, and an increased sense of accomplishment."

PowerCorps_PHL

Camden PowerCorps is modeled after the PowerCorps_PHL program in Philadelphia. Similar in design and structure, PowerCorps_PHL targets the same population, proposes the same intervention,

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and seeks the same intended outcomes/outputs as Camden PowerCorps. According to a recent PowerCorps_PHL report, members have diverted 15 tons of debris from the City of Philadelphia's water system, planted 1,329 trees and revitalized over 1,000 acres of public land to date. PowerCorps_PHL provides much needed support to Philadelphia Parks and Recreation (PPR) in their efforts to ensure all City parks are safe, clean, and ready to use. PowerCorps_PHL has also become a valuable partner with the Philadelphia Water Department (PWD) in their efforts to build and maintain green stormwater infrastructure.

Each year, PowerCorps_PHL enrolls 100 highly at-risk 18 to 26 year olds in a 6-month AmeriCorps program. Members develop the skills required to become environmental stewards, secure meaningful work, and become civically engaged members of society. Alumni of the program are regularly invited back to speak to current members about the value of their PowerCorps_PHL experience. Their experience has allowed them to develop greater confidence in their ability to continue on a positive path beyond their term of service. Of those who completed PowerCorps_PHL, 80% have transitioned to some combination of employment, post-secondary education, or additional national service.

Additional research and evidence was reviewed and helped inform the design of PowerCorps. Studies include the Sustainable Business Network of Philadelphia's "Capturing the Storm: Profits, Jobs, and Training in Philadelphia's Stormwater Industry", the US EPA's "The Importance of Operation and Maintenance for the Long-Term Success of Green Infrastructure" 2013, The Council of State Governments Justice Center's "Integrated Reentry and Employment Strategies: Reducing Recidivism and Promoting Job Readiness" 2013, Hazen and Sawyer's, a nationally recognized stormwater engineering firm, "Successful Maintenance of Green Infrastructure for Stormwater Management: Staten Island Bluebelt" 2009, and The Urban Alliance's "Youth Employment Matters!" 2014.

NOTICE PRIORITY

Camden PowerCorps directly aligns with the CNCS Funding Priorities of Environmental Stewardship and Economic Opportunity. Camden PowerCorps will recruit economically disadvantaged youth from one of four programs already established and working with the target population in Camden City: Center for Family Services, Youthbuild Camden, Work Group, and the Multi-Agency Life Line (M.A.L.L.) Program. PowerCorps is similar in design to the 21st Century Service Corps: AmeriCorps members will work to protect, restore, and enhance Camden City's public spaces. Their work will help

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spur economic development and increase access to Camden City's park systems. A strong emphasis on job and life skills training will help prepare AmeriCorps members for jobs in the field of green infrastructure. These trainings will educate AmeriCorps members on environmental stewardship and train them in how best to communicate gained knowledge regarding environmental stewardship to their community. This train-the-trainer technique will facilitate a larger, neighborhood-wide behavioral change to create the next generation of active civic participants and stewards of natural resources.

MEMBER TRAINING

AmeriCorps members will begin their term of service in late September 2015 with ten days of orientation and training prior to the start of their direct service. The training will be coordinated by Center for Family Services in collaboration with Camden City, Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and Cooper's Ferry Partnership. This introductory training will be devoted to developing an ethic of service and civic responsibility, preparing and planning for the service year and, for re-upping members who served previously in other AmeriCorps programs, building on the skills and experiences of their prior terms.

During Week One, training will focus on acclimating members to service and the role they will play in Camden City as a whole, and with their specific service assignment in particular. Training will cover topics that begin developing core competencies required by all members and will include workshops on the history and current status of national service and AmeriCorps, Center for Family Services, and Camden City communities. Additional training will cover the terms and conditions of their service, including a review of the AmeriCorps member contract and handbook, a thorough review of prohibited activities, and completion of forms. Week One will also include interactive workshops focused on de-escalation, communication and conflict resolution skills as well as problem solving and time management. The ethic of service, service professionalism and civic engagement components will be introduced along with tools for engaging in regular reflection on their service experience.

Week Two will begin with all members together in sessions designed to foster a strong sense of team and educate members on the specific objectives of Camden PowerCorps. From there, AmeriCorps members will be introduced to staff from Cooper's Ferry Partnership and the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority who will begin the process of imparting the knowledge, techniques, and

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strategies specific to member' specific service assignments. Among other topics, members will learn about the tools they will use, the gear they will wear, procedures for ensuring their own safety and that of fellow team members, transportation and communication protocols, and inclement weather policies. Finally, the Center for Family Services will begin the yearlong process of ensuring AmeriCorps members are able to leverage the skills they are developing to secure meaningful jobs upon completion of their term of service.

Following two weeks of pre-service training, AmeriCorps members will participate in one three-day period of additional training per month. These trainings will address Camden City's real and specific environmental conditions as well as job and life skills. The life skills trainings will focus on soft skills such as office etiquette, public speaking, financial education, networking, resume writing, and other job search and retention skills for post-AmeriCorps employment. Members will also share their best practices by leading peer-to-peer sessions. As per AmeriCorps guidelines, prohibited activities such as lobbying, will be introduced during pre-service training and periodically reviewed with members, staff, and community volunteers, particularly when elections are imminent.

To supplement the supports provided through structured trainings, Camden PowerCorps will employ one social service coordinator who will manage the additional issues that may crop up during a member's year of service. This could include issues pertaining to housing, interpersonal problems, childcare, or health challenges. In addition to the City department supervisor, who will teach members the hard skills they need to complete their service, Center for Family Services staff will work with the City departments to manage day-to-day issues that may hinder successful completion of expected service. These Center for Family Services staff will be skilled in conflict resolution, setting standards of professionalism (e.g., showing up on time, using appropriate communication strategies, etc.) and providing the additional support members may need to remain committed throughout the year.

MEMBER SUPERVISION

AmeriCorps members will serve in teams of 10, supervised by a full-time team leader, employed by Center for Family Services, who will support the members while holding them accountable. Team leaders will maintain close communication with each of the individual assigned contacts from one of the three Service Partners, either: 1) Cooper's Ferry Partnership, 2) Camden County Municipal

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Utilities Authority, or 3) the City of Camden, to ensure the successful completion of service assignments. This team leader, who will be supervised and supported by the Center for Family Services Program Manager, will serve as a link to Center for Family Services and City resources, and assist in member and program management and support. Each team of AmeriCorps members will have 1 Assistant Crew Leader, who will be members themselves. This program component will begin after the first cohort is completed and will be based on members completing a second term. The Assistant Crew Leaders will be selected for their maturity and interpersonal skills, are likely to be among the older members, and may be those with prior AmeriCorps experience. This position will serve as the phase II, more intensive opportunity for those youth who choose to complete a second term.

All members, regardless of service assignment, will have constant contact with the Workforce Development Coordinator who will support them and their team leader to ensure they are engaged in meaningful service, that they are getting constructive feedback, that their views are being heard and addressed, and that they are being provided appropriate supplies and materials. In addition, one social service manager will be responsible to ensure members are able to access the full range of social service resources available to them through our recruitment partners (Center for Family Services, Youthbuild Camden, Work Group, and the Multi-Agency Life Line (M.A.L.L.) Program).

Team leaders will be hired based on their prior experience working with at-risk populations and their enthusiasm for the program's goals and objectives. Once on board, they will be extensively trained in supervisory practices, policies, and procedures. Their training will cover a range of topics, including team building, assigning members to specific tasks, member evaluation, coaching, utilization of Center for Family Services staff and resources, and prohibited activities.

MEMBER EXPERIENCE

Members will be engaged in activities, primarily outdoors, in which they will typically be able to see immediate results. Through ongoing training and support from their team leaders and Service Partner contacts, members will also come to understand how those immediately visible results contribute to longer-term, more enduring, and far more profound changes in the environment. Thus, we expect the Camden PowerCorps service experience to be very powerful as it will provide ongoing opportunities for members to develop the skills and confidence required to make a difference that will

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affect the lives of the residents of Camden City for many years to come.

Active citizenship and the development of a life-long ethic of civic responsibility will be embedded in all aspects of the AmeriCorps experience — from formal training provided by Center for Family Services, to daily opportunities for reflection facilitated by team leaders, to consistent messaging from all of the adults and officials affiliated with the program, most especially Governor Christie and Mayor Redd. Center for Family Services will utilize the National Youth Leadership Council's Learning by Giving' resources from the National Constitution Center's Education Department, as well as curriculum provided through the CNCS Resource Center, National Service Learning Clearinghouse, and materials designed by Camden County College. Training sessions will promote dialogue, combine character education with active citizenship, and employ community problem solving techniques to foster a culture of care and action for all members where they realize their potential as change agents during and after their year of service. Throughout their term of service, members will reflect on their engagement in active citizenship through team discussions and in training sessions.

Finally, the Center for Family Services will encourage and support AmeriCorps members to participate in any state or national opportunities related to AmeriCorps or CNCS. Center for Family Services holds another AmeriCorps grant as well as an AmeriCorps VISTA grant. Center for Family Services will facilitate the interactions between these three AmeriCorps service groups to help foster a corps spirit across the programs through team building activities, group service projects, etc.

COMMITMENT TO AMERICORPS IDENITIFICATION

Particular attention will be paid to ensuring public awareness of Camden PowerCorps as an AmeriCorps program. Among other things, the AmeriCorps logo will be prominently displayed on PowerCorps member uniforms. Further, Center for Family Services, as a current and experienced AmeriCorps grantee, is familiar and compliant with CNCS recommendations on branding. The AmeriCorps logo is on everything Center for Family Services produces and will be on everything generated for PowerCorps, including uniforms, recruitment materials, signage, promotions and reports.

Center for Family Services has a long and active history of collaborating with other national service programs, so PowerCorps members will have frequent opportunities to serve in partnership with

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AmeriCorps members from many of Camden City's other AmeriCorps programs. In addition, members will be introduced early in their year to other AmeriCorps members serving at Center for Family Services and locally at other programs. Finally, AmeriCorps members will be formally oriented to Mayor Redd's and Governor Christie's commitment to service. Camden PowerCorps will also be integrated into the City's overall service plan, and outcomes will be reported publicly on an annual basis.

Organizational Capability

ORGANIZATIONAL BACKGROUND AND STAFFING

The City of Camden is the applicant in collaboration with the State of New Jersey and the local partners for the Governor and Mayor Initiative and together have identified Center for Family Services, the Cooper's Ferry Partnership, and Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority to participate as Founding Partners of Camden PowerCorps. Each of these organizations were carefully selected as founding partners based on either experience in administering AmeriCorps grants and programs, significant ties to and experience with community engagement, and technical knowledge of green infrastructure maintenance.

Center for Family Services was selected as the lead non-profit to guide the development and implementation of Camden PowerCorps based on the alignment of their mission with the City of Camden and their proven track record and extensive experience managing AmeriCorps programs and funding. Center for Family Services is a nonprofit human services agency with over 90 years of experience serving youth and families. The vision of Center for Family Services is for all people to lead capable, responsible, fulfilled lives in strong families and healthy communities. The mission of Center for Family Services is to support and empower individuals, families, and communities to achieve a better life through vision, hope, and strength. Center for Family Services has had a growing presence in the southern New Jersey region since its inception in 1920. Center for Family Services' boasts more than 65 programs with a focus on community outreach, school based and after school programs, substance abuse and intensive home based treatment programs, individual and family counseling, case management, foster care, and emergency shelters and residential facilities for at-risk youth.

Center for Family Services has managed several programs on behalf of the Office of the Mayor, including Cure4Camden, the National Forum on Youth Violence Prevention, and the M.A.L.L. Program. As a large multi-service non-profit organization, Center for Family Services has strong

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administrative and organizational capacity, which includes human resources, finance, development and public relations, and IT departments that manage, sustain, and build large agency initiatives.

Center for Family Services currently administers over \$34 million from both public and private grants.

Center for Family Services has been operating AmeriCorps programs since 2010 and currently runs an AmeriCorps program and an AmeriCorps VISTA program with up to 24 members and will bring this experience to bear on this effort. The Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority is a leader in Camden City in green infrastructure development. Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority will provide technical oversight and help identify and secure the service partners where the AmeriCorps members will serve. In addition, the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority will serve as one of the placements for the AmeriCorps members. Finally, Cooper's Ferry Partnership is an expert in community engagement and planning. In addition, Cooper's Ferry helps to lead the Camden Collaborative Initiative, a group of 35+ environmental agencies that focuses on positive environmental change in Camden City. Support letters from local organizations, organizations involved in the Camden Collaborative Initiative, for the implementation of Camden PowerCorps are on file at Cooper's Ferry Partnership. Cooper's Ferry will ensure that the community and local partner organizations participate in the implementation and support of Camden PowerCorps.

Under the leadership of the Office of the Mayor, Center for Family Services will hire all staff related to the management structure for Camden PowerCorps. The Chief Operating Officer and the Associate Vice President from Center for Family Services will provide oversight of the program in coordination with Cooper's Ferry Partnership and Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority. Additional staff to be hired include: 1) Program Director — manages program staff and manages daily responsibility for all Camden PowerCorps activities including reporting; 2) 3 Team Leaders — each supervises a team of 10 members and help to organize and run trainings for the AmeriCorps members; 3) Assistant Crew Leader — The Assistant Crew Leader will be an AmeriCorps program member who has joined for a second term and has demonstrated exceptional leadership; 4) Social Service Coordinator —works with the support staff of the four agencies which recruited members to coordinate supportive services for members; 5) Workforce Development Coordinator — works to enhance AmeriCorps members employability through coordination with outside organizations to facilitate post-PowerCorps employment opportunities and the organization of the on-going life and job skills trainings.

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Management structure for Camden PowerCorps: The Governor and Mayor will provide ultimate oversight of this initiative. Each office will receive reports from, and provide recommendations to, an Advisory Committee comprised of 1 appointee from the Governor's Office, 1 appointee from the Mayor's Office, the Chief Operating Officer from Center for Family Services, the Executive Director of the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and the Vice President of Neighborhood Initiatives from Cooper's Ferry Partnership. Day to day operational oversight will be the responsibility of the Chief Operating Officer from the Center for Family Services. The Mayor's Office will provide the Chief Operating Officer and the City Manager with support in grant management, financial oversight, and audit compliance.

COMPLIANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

While the City of Camden and State of New Jersey are the applicants, Center for Family Services, given its extensive experience managing AmeriCorps funding, will be delegated as fiduciary agent for the program and responsible for ensuring compliance with CNCS rules, for detecting and preventing noncompliance, and for correcting any instances of noncompliance.

Center for Family Services, Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and Cooper's Ferry Partnership will review the prohibited activities, such as lobbying, in detail with its own and partner agency staff. All AmeriCorps members, community volunteers, and Service Partners will receive training on risks, compliance issues, and prohibited and unallowable activities. If any individual is caught in violation of the trainings, the PowerCorps Advisory Committee will determine next steps to get back in compliance.

Some of the PowerCorps personnel, including the Program Director, Team Leaders, Social Service Coordinator, and Workforce Development Coordinator will be hired from outside Center for Family Services while others will be transferred from current Center for Family Services programs. Each of these positions will require previous experience working with at-risk youth, a commitment to civic values, a passion for the overall objectives of PowerCorps, and a strong interest in learning about and adhering to AmeriCorps policies. All other program staff will be experienced Center for Family Services staff who are deeply familiar with CNCS rules.

Cost Effectiveness and Budget Adequacy

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COST EFFECTIVENESS

This proposal requests \$411,000 to support the cost of 30 Member Service Years (MSY). This amount does not exceed the maximum \$13,700 per MSY. The partners will provide a cash match to ensure effective implementation of the program. An initial commitment of \$200,000 has been secured as a cash match, and the founding partners are continuing to identify and secure both cash and in-kind funding to support the program. The City and Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority have already identified and committed to Camden PowerCorps. The match funding will go directly towards the staffing and administrative costs and equipment needed to run the program. The City along with Center for Family Services, Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and Cooper's Ferry Partnership are confident that the total \$822,000 will be sufficient to properly run the program.

In addition, in order to keep budget costs to a minimum, Cooper's Ferry Partnership, the City, and members of the Camden Collaborative Initiative (the local environmental advocacy coalition) are providing significant in-kind resources in the form of staff time, access to equipment and supplies, and data collection. The City, Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority, and Cooper's Ferry Partnership are taking responsibility for reaching out to individual donors, foundations, and potential employers of PowerCorps graduates for further financial support. Both the Governor and Mayor are confident that the proposed budget can be sustained for at the least the three-year grant period.

According to the White House Council for Community Solutions report, the need for broad national action and collaboration among business, nonprofit, and community leaders is urgent. In 2011 alone, taxpayers shouldered more than \$93 billion to compensate for lost taxes and direct costs to support young people disengaged from both education and work. In their analysis The Economic Value of Disconnected Youth, researchers found that, over the lifetime of this group, the cost to society is estimated to be \$4.7 trillion. Through Camden PowerCorps, Camden City will not only be using a best practice approach to engage and support opportunity youth, but will connect them to meaningful roles to improve their own communities in meaningful and long term ways.

Maintaining the green infrastructure systems throughout Camden City triggers a multi-pronged benefit. For one, with the implementation of green infrastructure in favor of grey infrastructure, Camden City saves significantly on capital costs for stormwater management.

Managing the stormwater properly also positively impacts water quality, decreases flooding episodes,

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and can improve the public health of communities. This Mayor's and Governor's AmeriCorps program is a comprehensive, multi-pronged approach that enables youth to take key steps to strengthen their future and have a tremendous impact on their environment and the community in which they live.

BUDGET ADEQUACY

The PowerCorps budget outlines the program staff: 6 Center for Family Services employees will be dedicated full time to implementation of this ambitious program, and a ratio of 1 staff member for each 5 AmeriCorps members. The budget dedicates significant resources to staffing to ensure that the at-risk youth recruited to serve as AmeriCorps members will have the training, supervision, and ongoing support required to ensure they both achieve the intended project outputs/outcomes and develop the skills and confidence required to successfully enter the workforce upon completion of their service. In addition, the budget includes the resources required to provide the extensive training called for in the program narrative.

The budget is designed with an eye to long-term sustainability. Under the leadership of the Office of the Mayor, this project is designed to have a cross sector approach, as well as cross sector funding to ensure that the activities and the funding are mutually reinforcing to meet the overall community goals and the goals of the partners.

The proposed budget is directly in line with the program narrative. It includes living allowances for 30 MSY (60 part time members each serving 6 month full time terms, as well as fringe benefits for these members). It includes the salary and fringe benefits for the Program Manager and other direct service staff. The budget supports the program design as it includes resources for staff training and travel to Corporation for National and Community Service conferences, computers and program supplies for the program staff and members, uniforms for AmeriCorps members, and AmeriCorps State patches for t-shirt sleeves.

The budget as submitted contains no mathematical errors and contains sufficient information to assess how each of the line items is calculated.



WHEREAS, the Ad Hoc committee, led by Chairperson Nichelle Pace, examined all aspects of the cannabis legislation, including but not limited to, the community impact of permitting recreational cannabis in the City, significant issues related to social responsibility, education, diversity, the impact on the medical and education communities as well as the impact on local businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Ad Hoc Committee submitted its report and recommendations to the City Council of the City of Camden on September 7, 2021, and the work of the Ad Hoc Cannabis Committee was not only extraordinary, considering the difficult timeframe it faced, but unrivaled in its thoughtful review and examination of the opportunities and commensurate challenges that the City faces in overseeing the sale and production of recreational cannabis in the City; now therefore

- 1.2 In the event there are changes to the Contractor's services including any change in the amount of the Contractor's compensation, a supplement or amendment to this Agreement may be negotiated at the request of either party and incorporated in written amendments to this Agreement. To the extent that any terms of this contract and the attached Proposal are inconsistent or expressly conflict with any of the terms of the contract, the terms of the contract shall prevail.

ARTICLE TWO SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

2.1 The Contractor shall commence work on the Project as described in the attached RFP and response to RFP once the authorization to proceed is given by the City Attorney.

ARTICLE THREE COMPENSATION

- 3.1. The City agrees to pay or cause to be paid to Contractor for services rendered pursuant to this contract an amount not to exceed ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.00) for direct expenses of legal services at a rate of \$165.00 per hour for all attorneys, \$105.00 for paralegals and law clerks and \$125.00 for Technology Assistants for a period of one (1) year. The parties acknowledge that the City is subject to the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15, which states that this contract shall be subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds.
- 3.2. Payment shall be based upon the schedule of fees and costs set forth in the attached RFP and response to RFP and specifically as follows:
 - 3.3. The terms and conditions of payment shall be as follows:
- 3.3.1 Upon submission by Contractor to the City of Camden Department of Law with a copy to the Finance Department, a monthly invoice setting forth with specificity the actual hours of work performed on specific assignments in accordance with this Agreement and a detailed breakdown of costs and charges; then upon certification by the Law Department that the work was done or articles furnished in a satisfactory manner; then upon presentation by the Contractor to the Law Department with the said invoice and Certification in Lieu of Affidavit that the work done or articles

furnished are according to this contract and according to law and not upon any secret promises to pay any bonus in money or property as detailed on the invoice.

3.4 The City will not pay for in-house communications of Counsel such as conferences, meetings, phone calls, e-mails, and text messages, etc. between partner and associate; associate and paralegal or other support staff; partner and partner; partner and paralegal or other support staff. The City also will not pay for phone calls/bills. The City will not pay for any photocopying (in house or out). The City will not pay for any communications between the Office of the City Attorney and Counsel such as phone calls, email, text messages, meetings and written correspondence, etc. The City will not pay for meals. The City will only pay for travel time related to a Court hearing or other event requiring mandatory attendance. Billings for allowed travel are to be billed at one-half of your proposed rates.

ARTICLE FOUR GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

4.1 RECORDS

CONTRACTOR and any subcontractors shall keep, or cause to be kept accurate records and books of accounts, shall record and report in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures and with all essential details, the receipt and disbursement of all funds under the terms of this Agreement. The CITY shall have access at all reasonable times to all records and books of accounts pertaining to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that any payment made by CITY to CONTRACTOR under the terms and conditions of this agreement is subject to audit. CONTRACTOR shall preserve all documents, records and books of account pertaining to this payment for inspection and/or audit by any authorized representatives of the CITY or its audit agency. Copies thereof, if requested, shall be furnished to either or the foregoing. The CITY shall be furnished with all records, files, etc. for matters litigated on behalf of the CITY once the matter has been finalized.

4.2 NO MONEY FOR PARTISAN POLITICAL ACTIVITY

The money provided by the CITY under this Agreement shall not be used for any partisan political activity, for furthering the election or defeat of any candidate for public office, or for any other purpose prohibited by the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501, et seq.). The contractor is required to file an annual disclosure statement on political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("ELEC") pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.13 (P.L. 2005, c. 271, s.3) for contracts in excess of \$50,000 from the City in a calendar year. All updated annual disclosure statements shall be filed with the City as long as this agreement is in effect.

4.3 PRIOR CONSENS OF CITY FOR DISTRIBUTION OF INFORMATION

No information or material gathered under this Agreement shall be made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the CITY.

4.4 NON-ASSIGNABILITY

CONTRACTOR shall not assign any interest or delegate any duty arising from this Agreement without the prior written consent of the CITY.

4.5 NONDISCRIMINATION AND EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY REQUIREMENT PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 ET SEQ. AND N.J.A.C. 17:27

During the performance of this contract, CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such equal employment opportunity shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting, forth provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex;

The contractor or subcontractor will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act

and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A.10:5-31 et seq. as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (the "Act") (42 U.S.C. 12101 et. seq.). The contractor is obligated to comply with the Act and hold the City harmless.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals established in accordance with **N.J.A.C.17:27-5.2** promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended and supplemented from time to time.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personnel testing conforms with the principles of jobrelated testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

In conforming with the targeted employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

- 1. Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval
 - a. Appropriate evidence that the contractor is operating under an existing federally approved or sanctioned affirmative action program;

- 2. extificate of Employee Information Report

 a. A certificate of employee information report approval, issued in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-4; or
- 3. Employee Information Report Form AA302

a. An employee information report (Form AA302) electronically provided by the Division and distributed to the public agency, through the Division's website, to be completed by the contractor, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-4.

The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Purchase and Property, Contract Compliance Audit Unit (CCAU), Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Monitoring Program as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Purchase and Property, CCAU, EEO Monitoring Program for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.

No firm shall be issued a contract unless it complies with the EEO/Affirmative Action statutory requirements as stated above.

4.6 <u>TERMINATION FOR CAUSE</u>

If for any reason, CONTRACTOR fails to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this agreement, or if CONTRACTOR violates any of the conditions, covenants, agreements or stipulations of this agreement, the CITY shall, thereupon, have the right to terminate this agreement by giving written notice to CONTRACTOR of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least thirty days before such date. In that event, all or any part of finished or unfinished materials prepared by CONTRACTOR shall, at the option of the CITY, become its property and CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to just and equitable compensation for the materials accepted by the CITY.

Notwithstanding the above, CONTRACTOR shall not be relieved of liability to the CITY for damages sustained by the CITY by virtue of any breach of this Agreement.

4.7 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE OF THE CITY

The CITY may terminate this agreement at its convenience at any time by giving written notice to CONTRACTOR of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof at least seven days before the effective date of such termination. In that event of termination for the convenience of the CITY, CITY shall pay CONTRACTOR for all

hardware, software, and services delivered or performed up to the date of cancellation, and all work in progress that was requested by the City prior to cancellation for which CONTRACTOR has already incurred costs, and for that portion of the actual out of pocket expenses (not otherwise reimbursed under this contract) incurred by CONTRACTOR during the contract period which are directly attributable to the uncompleted portion of the services covered by this contract.

4.8 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- a. No officer, member or employee of the CITY and no member of its governing body and no other public official of the governing body of the locality or localities in which the project is situated or being carried out who exercises any function or responsibilities in the review or approval in the undertaking or carrying out of this project shall participate in any decision relating to this contract which affects his personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which it is, directly or indirectly, interested or have any personal pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the proceeds thereof.
- b. CONTRACTOR covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required under this contract. CONTRACTOR further covenants that in the performance of this contract no person having any such interest shall be employed.
- c. No members of or delegates to the Congress of the United States and no Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit arising from it.

4.9 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND LOCAL LAWS

CONTRACTOR shall fulfill all requirements imposed by the Federal government on expenditures, grants and other uses of money derived by the CITY from the Federal government. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and codes of the State of New Jersey and the City of Camden.

This contract is entered into in accordance with and subject to compliance of both parties with the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law and including providing the required "Ownership Disclosure Statement", "Non-Collusion Affidavit", and "N.J. Business Registration Certificate".

The City is prohibited from contracting with persons or entities engaging in certain investment activities in energy or finance sectors of Iran as regulated by P.L. 2012, c.25.

4.10 CHANGES

The CITY may from time to time request changes in the Scope of Services of the CONTRACTOR to be performed under this Agreement.

Such changes, including any decrease or increase in the amount of the CONTRACTOR'S compensation, which are mutually agreed upon between the CITY and the CONTRACTOR, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Agreement.

4.11 INDEMNIFICATION

CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City from and against any and all losses, costs (including litigation costs and counsel fees), claims, suits, actions, damages, liability and expenses brought by any third party alleging loss of life, bodily and personal injury, or damage to property, occasioned wholly or in part by Contractor's negligent act or omission or the negligent act or omission of Contractor's agents, sub-consultants, employees or servants in conjunction with Contractor's performance of services under this Agreement.

4.12 ENTIRE UNDERSTANDING

This written Agreement, including the Maintenance Agreement and its Schedules, represents the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

AND, the party of the second part further agrees to comply with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:5-12 regarding unlawful employment practices and discrimination; and all other applicable federal, state laws and municipal ordinances regarding employment practices and discrimination. The violation of any of the aforesaid statutes or ordinances by the party of the second part shall be a breach of the entire contract and the party of the first part shall have the option of canceling the remaining portion of the contract, rescinding the contract in its entirety or continuing the contract subject to the remedies, penalties or other mandatory action available to the party of the first part under the law.

AND, the party of the second part hereby certifies that no bonus, or other consideration has or will be given, received or promised to the servants, agents or employees of the party of the first part for the awarding of this contract.


