Please note summary of Public Decorum rules below.

Rule XVII: Decorum

Any person who shall disturb the peace of the Council, make impertinent or slanderous remarks or conduct himself in a boisterous manner while addressing the Council shall be forthwith barred by the presiding officer from further audience before the Council, except that if the speaker shall submit to proper order under these rules, permission for him to continue may be granted by a majority vote of the Council.

City Council meetings shall be conducted in a courteous manner. Citizens and Council members will be allowed to state their positions in an atmosphere free of slander, threats of violence or the use of Council as a forum for politics. Sufficient warnings may be given by the Chair at any time during the remarks and, in the event that any individual shall violate the rules of decorum heretofore set forth, the Chairperson may then cut off comment or debate. At the discretion of the Chairperson, light signals may be used to display the commencement of the time for speaking and a warning light may be flashed to show that the appropriate time has passed. A red light will signal that there is no longer time.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING MC-4918, ADOPTED ON AUGUST 11, 2015, WHICH AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF VEHICLES AND PEDESTRIANS IN THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF CAMDEN AND THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF", ORDINANCE 717, ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 27, 1945; WHICH NOW DESIGNATES THE AREA BETWEEN PEARL STREET AND STATE STREET AS ONE BOUNDARY AND SECOND STREET AND SIXTH STREET AS THE SECOND BOUNDARY AS A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT ZONE.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 717, "Providing for the Regulation of Vehicles and Pedestrians in the Streets of the City of Camden and the Enforcement Thereof," was adopted on December 27, 1945; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 717 was amended by MC-4918, on August 11, 2015 to include Residential Parking Permit Zones for the Downtown Camden Area and also the Parkside Area; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Camden now seeks to amend MC-4918 to include and designate the area between Pearl Street and State Street as one boundary and Second Street and Sixth Street as a second boundary, as a Residential Parking Permit Zone; and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2021, the Parking Authority of the City of Camden ("Parking Authority"), pursuant to Chapter 550 [formerly Chapter 388] of the Camden City Code, following a public hearing on August 5, 2021, passed a resolution adopting the findings of the Executive Director of the Parking Authority and designating a Residential Parking Permit Zone during weekdays for the area between Pearl Street and State Street and Second Street and Sixth Street (the "Proposed Zone"); and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the Parking Authority, in his August 20, 2021 report made pursuant to Section 550-5 of the Camden City Code, made the following findings:

- Residents in the Proposed Zone have difficulty parking on-street due to the daily parking of Rutgers students;
- Residents in the Proposed Zone have difficulty parking on-street due to the daily parking of other visitors to Camden for business or waterfront events;
- On-street parking in the Proposed Zone is a limited resource for residents in the neighborhood who are often denied convenient parking to their residences;
- 4. Improvements to the overall health and safety of the Proposed Zone have increased on-street parking demand from non-residents; and
- Increased enforcement and improved signage could make additional on-street parking available for the convenience of residents in the Proposed Zone;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Camden, based on the report of the Executive Director of the Parking Authority as well as the Resolution of the Parking Authority recommending that the City Council of the City of Camden "expand the Residential Parking Permit Zone to include the above Proposed Zone," now seeks to amend and supplement MC-4918; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Camden that MC-4918 is amended and supplemented, as follows:

SECTION 1. Same.

SECTION 2. Parking, shall be amended and supplemented to include:

- 1. A Residential Parking Permit Zone which shall be established for the area between Pearl Street and State Street as one boundary and Second Street and Sixth Street as a second boundary as a Residential Parking Permit Zone (the "Proposed Zone").
- 2. This Residential Parking Permit Zone shall be established and remain in place during each week from Monday at 7:00 a.m. through Friday, at 11:00 p.m.
- Signs shall be posted on each street within the Proposed Zone advising that this area is a
 Residential Parking Permit Zone along with the hours of operation of the Residential Parking
 Permit Zone

SECTION 3: Any portion of the City Code not herein amended and supplemented shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 6: If any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance. Furthermore, the other provisions of this ordinance are deemed to be severable and remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23 and N.J.S.A. 40:69A-41, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Mayor, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to approve or veto this Ordinance. Additionally, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the State Commissioner of Community Affairs, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to veto this Ordinance, and the action by the Commissioner regarding this Ordinance shall supersede any action by the Mayor on the same Ordinance. All notices of approval and/or veto shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Right Place, Right Time, Right Here: PARKSIDE!

According to Parkside's 2019 Market Study, there is demand for newly constructed and rehabilitated housing in the city of Camden. Currently, despite the demand, there are a limited number of quality homes available for individuals/families interested in pursuing homeownership.

PBCIP is seeking funding to finance the development of 10-units of for-sale housing to single-family households ranging in income from 60% to 80% of Area Median Income. Total cost for the project is approximately \$2,541,700. For-sale initiative includes the rehab and construction of 3 bedroom units on targeted streets – Haddon, Kenwood, Empire and Princess Avenues - to amass visibility and impact. Homes to be redeveloped are located in areas that are highly marketable and residential corridors that will garner strong demand given the large number of income-eligible households in the area and the lack of availability of quality residential housing for sale. Single family units will range from \$100,000 to \$125,000.

The most compelling reasons for purchasing a home in Parkside are its reasonable housing prices that compare well to other parts of south Jersey and the benefits of living within close proximity of Philadelphia where there is a range of employment, education and cultural opportunities. Newly constructed and rehabilitated houses with a mix of number of bedrooms and bathrooms, will compare very favorably with most of the existing and available houses currently found in the city

Through the 10-unit project, PBCIP will contribute new resources and expertise to the Parkside community, ensuring a holistic approach to new construction and rehabilitation. Objectives for the project include:

- Elimination of slum and blight (CFR570208 specified)
- Beneficial to moderate income persons (CFR570208 specified)
- ❖ Inspire private investment in the form of residential development
- * Renewal of an urban residential neighborhood where success is sustainable

Real Estate Analyst Robin Weiss of RJW Housing Analytics, in the 2019 Parkside market study, provides an understanding of the issues of supply and demand in the local Camden/Parkside market to analyze the factors that could impact absorption and marketability. The market study asserts "given the large number of income eligible households in the primary market area and the lack of availability among appropriate rental and sales properties in the overall market area, there should be strong demand and reasonable rent-up/sales".

The study further indicates the following absorption rates –

- ❖ Anticipated For-Sale Absorption 3 to 4 units per month
- ❖ Absorption for Condominium 5 units per month

Through PBCIP's financial literacy program, the HOPE Institute, PBCIP has seen an uptick of program participants over the past three (3) years with over 300 individuals seeking financial sustainability education to create budgets and debt reduction plans to increase their mortgage affordability. We currently have identified over 70 individuals that are ready or will be ready to purchase homes within the next 9-12 months. Many of the individuals who are currently pre-approved are frustrated due to the lack of quality affordable housing in Camden and the state of NJ; while other clients are worried that once they do become mortgage ready they will not be able to afford a house that does not need substantial construction to make it habitable.

Evaluation measures used to determine success of PBCIP's 10-unit project include -

- Financing secured
- % local labor force
- # units under construction
- # certificates of occupancy
- # units sold
- # mortgages

Any ordinance prohibiting parking at the location specified is hereby rescinded and appealed, in part, wherein it conflicts with the ordinance to be adopted.

SECTION 3. Any portion of this ordinance not herein amended and supplemented shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AND CONTROL RECREATIONAL CANNABIS LICENSES IN THE CITY OF CAMDEN

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act" (the "Act"), N.J.S.A. 24:61-32 et seq., which legalizes the recreational use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial recreational (adult use) cannabis operations, use and possession; and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes six marketplace classes of licensed businesses, including:

- a) Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator license, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;
- Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;
- c) Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;
- d) Class 4 Cannabis Distributer license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from on licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;
- e) Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers; and
- f) Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license, for businesses providing courier services for consumer purchases that are fulfilled by a licensed cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the purchases items to a consumer, and which service would include the ability of a consumer to make a purchase directly through the cannabis delivery service which would be presented by the delivery service for fulfillment by a retailer and then delivered to a consumer.

WHEREAS, section 31a of the Act authorizes municipalities by ordinance to adopt regulations governing the number of cannabis establishments (defined in section 3 of the Act as "a cannabis cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, or a cannabis retailer"), cannabis distributors or cannabis delivery services allowed to operate within their boundaries, as well as the location manner and times operation of such establishments, distributors or delivery services, and establishing civil penalties for the violation of any such regulations; and

WHEREAS, section 31b of the Act authorizes municipalities by ordinance to prohibit the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis establishments, distributors, or delivery services anywhere in the municipality; and

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2021, the City Council of the City of Camden approved an ordinance on first reading which amended Chapter 870 to prohibit the operation of any Class of cannabis business with the City's geographical boundaries; and

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2021, the City Council of the City of Camden referred the proposed amendments to Chapter 870 to the Planning Board for a report concerning this proposed action pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-26, and thereafter, the Planning Board issued a report recommending that the City of Camden amend Chapter 870 to prohibit any Class of cannabis business within the geographical boundaries of the City of Camden; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2021, with the recommendation of the Planning Board, the City Council of the City of Camden determined that, due to present uncertainties regarding the potential future impacts that allowing one or more classes of cannabis business might have on New Jersey municipalities in general, and on the City of Camden in particular, it was necessary and appropriate, and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the City of Camden's

residents and members of the public who visit, travel, or conduct business in the City of Camden to amend the City of Camden's zoning regulations to prohibit all manner of cannabis-related land use and development within the geographic boundaries of the City of Camden; and

WHEREAS, the City also appointed an ad hoc committee to examine and make recommendations to the Administration and Council of the City of Camden as to whether the City of Camden should permit one or more of the categories of Class 1 through Class 5 licenses in the City of Camden and the extent as to whether one or more licenses in each class should be permitted and also determining what the scope of those services should be as well as the types and number of licenses that should be allowed for license categories for Class 1 through Class 5, in the City of Camden and during its review, this ad hoc committee examined such significant issues as to how best to educate the residents in the four (4) Wards as well as local businesses of the purpose and scope of the Act, including discussing such issues as: what the definitions are of each license in Classes 1 through 6 identified in the Act and their scope; discussing the requirements of those individuals who could eligible to apply for each such class of license; City locations that could be permitted for each class of license; the community impact of such licenses being issued, including those aspects involving, but not limited to, social responsibility, education, diversity, the impact on the medical and education communities and the impact on local businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Ad Hoc Committee submitted its report and recommendations to the Administration of the City of Camden and the City Council of the City; and

WHEREAS, on August 19, 2021, the Cannabis Regulatory Commission ("CRC") enacted regulations at N.J.A.C. 17:30 which adopted pursuant to the Act and whose provisions contained in both the Act and N.J.A.C. 17:30 are hereby incorporated in this chapter by reference and made a part hereof as fully as though it had been set forth at length herein.

WHEREAS, the Administration of the City of Camden now seeks to adopt land use regulations and other requirements for cannabis businesses that can promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Administration of the City of Camden and City Council of the City of Camden have now determined to opt-in to the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6I-32 et seq. but only as provided for herein in this Chapter, and therefore, the City of Camden now seeks to adopt land use regulations and other requirements for cannabis businesses in the City of Camden that can promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Administration of the City of Camden now seeks to adopt land use regulations and other requirements for cannabis businesses that can promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Land Use Law, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et seq., delegates to municipalities the power to zone and regulate development within its borders by adopting or amending zoning ordinances relating to the nature and extent of the uses of land and structures thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Administration established a committee to review the recommendations of the Camden Ad Hoc Cannabis Committee for the purpose of drafting a proposed ordinance and this proposed ordinance was referred to the City Planning Board to ensure that the proposed ordinance which governed, among other things, the number of licensed cannabis businesses that will be permitted within the City as well as their location, manner, and times of operation; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board, at its meeting of determined that the proposed ordinance was consistent with the City's Master Plan, and made certain other recommendations with respect to the Report and Recommendations which it determined was consistent with the City's Master Plan, and which are to be included herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Camden as follows:

Purpose:

Notwithstanding any Federal law to the contrary, this Chapter is enacted to regulate and govern the use of Cannabis and the number and types of permits issued in the City pursuant to the Act. The City is awaiting regulations for same by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission (CRC) and reserves the right to revise this Chapter pursuant to same.

RECITALS INCORPORATED

The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

<u>Definitions</u>: the definitions and other provisions of the Act and N.J.A.C. 17:30 are hereby incorporated herein. Any amendments to the Act and N.J.A.C. 17:30-1.2 are also incorporated herein without the need to revise this Chapter.

- b) <u>State Licensure Required</u>: In order to locate within the City, a cannabis business must first obtain a license from the State Cannabis Commission. Such license must be in good standing during the entirety of the term of that business's operation within the City.
- c) The City, in determining zoning approval of a proposed location of a license applicant's cannabis businesses premises shall consider whether a cannabis business's premises conforms to zoning requirements based on the nature of the cannabis business's primary business operations. If zoning approval is granted, the City shall provide a letter or affidavit stating that the location will conform to zoning requirements allowing for activities related to the operations of the proposed cannabis business to be conducted at that location.
- d) Municipal Preference: Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-6.3, within twenty-eight (28) days of a receipt of a license application from the CRC, the City shall inform the CRC of its preference for the issuance of licenses to cannabis business and whether such license application complies with this Chapter.
- e) Evidence of City Support: In order to obtain a license from the Cannabis Regulatory Commission, a prospective licensee must provide evidence of support from the Administration and City Council of the City of Camden with respect to such application. As part of the City's review, the prospective licensee and the City shall discuss in good faith what community and social justice initiatives may be appropriate for the prospective licensee to undertake. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-5.1 (g), the City shall demonstrate proof of local support for the suitability of the cannabis business's proposed location by indicating that the intended location is appropriately located and otherwise suitable for activities related to the operations of the proposed cannabis business by the adoption of a resolution by City Council.
- f) Quality of Life Task Force: All cannabis businesses shall be subject to health and safety review, inspection, and enforcement, including but not limited to an annual health and safety review and inspection, by the City.

AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 870

870-38—PERMITTED USES IN CERTAIN DISTRICTS - CANNABIS LICENSED BUSINESSES - ISSUANCE OF LICENSES AND PERMITS

- A. All applications for licenses and permits, all licenses and permits issued and all proceedings under this Article shall be in accordance with all applicable laws of the state.
- B. All licenses and permits required by this Article shall be issued by City Administration which shall also administer the provisions of this Article. Any business duly licensed by the State of New Jersey to conduct legal adult use

cannabis operations, as defined by State law, may operate within the Specified Permitted Area so long as: (i) the entity maintains its State license in good standing; (ii) the entity maintains a City of Camden Business License in good standing; and (iii) the entity otherwise remains in full compliance with the laws and regulations established by the State of New Jersey and the City of Camden governing the licensed activity, as may be amended.

C. A Business License to operate within the City of Camden shall not be granted or renewed without such evidence as may be required by the Business Administrator to determine that the entity maintains all valid State and/or CRC licenses and approvals, and that all such licenses and/or approvals remain in good standing from the time of registration.

D. Licensing

- Local licensing authority.
 - a. The Business Administrator of the City of Camden is hereby designated to act as the local licensing authority for the City for all cannabis establishments. The Business Administrator, in reviewing and rendering decisions on all cannabis licenses, shall be assisted by the following individuals: the Business Administrator, the City Attorney, the Director of Planning and Development, the Director of Code Enforcement and the Chief of the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, or his/her designee. Under all circumstances in which State law requires communication to the City by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission or any other State agency with regard to the licensing of cannabis establishments by the State, or in which State law requires any review or approval by the City of any action taken by the State licensing authority, the exclusive authority for receiving such communications and granting such approvals shall be exercised by the Business Administrator.
 - b. Under no circumstances shall a local license for a cannabis establishment issued by the Business Administrator be effective until or unless the State has issued the requisite permits or licenses to operate such a facility. No cannabis establishment may lawfully operate in the City of Camden without the issuance of a State permit or license and full regulatory oversight of the cannabis establishment by the Cannabis Regulatory Commission or other state licensing authority as well as oversight and issuance of a license by the City.
 - c. Any permit issued pursuant to this Chapter shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from the date of issuance and shall be renewed in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter.
 - d. The Business Administrator may, at his or her discretion, adjust the renewal date of the local permit to correlate with an applicant's State licensing and renewal schedule.
 - e. Renewal of any permit shall be governed by any code amendments, additional restrictions or changes in the Act and N.J.A.C. 17:30 et seq. adopted since the previous permit was issued or renewed.
 - f. A licensee shall comply with N.J.A.C. 17:30-6.8 governing limitations on license-holders, owners, principals and passive investors, etc.
 - g. A licensee shall comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 17:30-9.3 governing transfers of ownership Interest.
 - h. Transfer of a license or change of location or modification to expand a permitted premise shall be subject to the approval of the Administration, the Planning Board and City Council. A potential transfer of a license caused by the death of a spouse, domestic partner or adult child shall not be unreasonably denied.
 - i. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-6.7 (d), a microbusiness holding an annual license shall not sell or transfer its license.

- j. Except where the Business Administrator has received a complete renewal application along with the requisite fees, and has issued a license renewal, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate after the date of a license expiration.
- Classification of licenses. The City, subject to State, Administration, Planning Board, Zoning Board of Adjustment, and City Council approval, may issue the following municipal licenses to operate a cannabis establishment:
 - a. Class 1 Cultivator License, for facilities involved in growing and cultivating cannabis;
 - Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer license, for facilities involved in the manufacturing, preparation, and packaging of cannabis items;
 - Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler license, for facilities involved in obtaining and selling cannabis items for later resale by other licensees;
 - d. Class 4 Cannabis Distributer license, for businesses involved in transporting cannabis plants in bulk from on licensed cultivator to another licensed cultivator, or cannabis items in bulk from any type of licensed cannabis business to another;
 - c. Class 5 Cannabis Retailer license for locations at which cannabis items and related supplies are sold to consumers.
- 3. Maximum number of licenses. The City may issue a maximum of the following licenses:
 - a. A maximum of one (1) standard or micro-business license operating under Class 1 shall be permitted to operate within the City only in commercial zone area specified below. A micro-business cannabis cultivator shall have a total cannabis grow area that does not exceed 2,500 square feet, measured on a horizontal plane, and 24 feet, measured vertically above the plane and shall possess no more than 1,000 cannabis plants each month.
 - b. A maximum total of three (3) standard or micro-business cannabis licenses operating under Class 2 shall be permitted to operate within the City only in commercial zone areas specified below. A Micro-business operating under this license shall acquire no more than 1000 pounds of cannabis per month.
 - c. A maximum total of three (3) standard or micro-business cannabis licenses operating under Class 3 shall be permitted within the City only in commercial zone areas specified below. A Micro-business operating under this license shall acquire no more than 1000 pounds of dry cannabis or its equivalent per month.
 - d. A maximum total of three (3) standard or micro-business cannabis licenses operating under Class 4 shall be permitted within the City only in commercial zone areas specified below. A Micro-business operating under this license shall possess no more than 1000 cannabis plants per month, except during transportation.
 - e. A maximum of 20 standard or microbusiness retail cannabis business licenses operating under Class 5 shall be permitted within the City in the commercial zones specified below; with no more than four (4) per zone. A Micro-business shall not acquire for retail sale more than 1000 pounds of cannabis or its equivalent per month.
- Location of Licenses: The following State classified cannabis classes are permitted in the corresponding zoning districts:
 - a. Class 1: Cultivator Commercial 3 and Light Industrial 2
 - b. Class 2; Manufacturer Light Industrial Zone LI-1
 - c. Class 3; Wholesale Light Industrial Zones, LI-1 and LI-2

- d. Class 4; Distributor Light Industrial Zone LI-1
- e. Class 5: Retail permitted in the following zones:
 - i. C-2 Zone Gateway/Waterfront South
 - ii. C-3 Zone Old Pathmark Area
 - iii. C-4 Zone Admiral Wilson Boulevard
 - iv. US Zone University Services
 - v. CC Zone Center City
- f. Class 6: Delivery In accordance with the Act, delivery of cannabis products within the City is authorized where permitted by State law.
- g. Any Delivery Service Provider seeking to establish a business in the City of Camden must comply with all applicable City of Camden Ordinances.

5. Application Process

- Any license conditionally issued by the City is contingent upon the locally licensed entity's or individual's subsequent recipient of a State permit or license of the same class or type of regulated cannabis activity.
- b. Persons wishing to obtain any classification of cannabis license shall file a license application with the Business Administrator, on a standardized form established by the Business Administrator and available in the Business Administrator's office. The Business Administrator shall establish a reasonable application period and deadline for all applications. An application shall be deemed incomplete, and shall not be processed by the Business Administrator, until all documents and application fees are submitted. To be deemed complete, all applications shall be accompanied by the following:
- c. The applicant shall submit proof that the applicant has or will have lawful possession of the premises proposed for the cannabis establishment, which proof may consist of: a deed, a lease, a real estate contract contingent upon successful licensing, or a binding letter of intent by the owner of the premises indicating an intent to lease the premises to the entrant contingent upon successful licensing.
- d. The applicant shall submit an affidavit and documentary proof of compliance with all state and local laws regarding affirmative action, antidiscrimination and fair employment practices. The applicant shall also certify under oath that they shall not discriminate based on race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin (ancestry), disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status, in any of its activities or operations.
- e. The location proposed for licensing by the applicant shall comply with all applicable municipal zoning laws and the location restrictions set forth in this Code.
- f. The applicant shall submit, to the satisfaction of the Business Administrator, proof of financial capability to open and operate the cannabis establishment for which the applicant is seeking a license. Standards for proof of financial capability shall be determined by the Business Administrator.
- g. The applicant and the application shall otherwise comply with any, and all qualification standards set forth by the State of New Jersey and City of Camden laws, regulations or ordinances.
- h. In the event there are multiple applicants for a license, the Business Administrator shall evaluate all applicants and issue a notification of award after consideration and evaluation of the following criteria:
 - Applicant's owners' or principals' qualifications and experience operating in highly regulated industries, including cannabis, healthcare, pharmaceutical manufacturing, and retail pharmacies, with preference to experience operating such

- businesses within the State of New Jersey and where the value of owners' experience shall outweigh the experience of nonowner principals; and
- Applicant's qualifications and experience related to public safety and security, including any of the applicant's owners' or principals' experience in law enforcement and drug enforcement and a summary of the applicant's plans for storage of products and currency, physical security, video surveillance, security personnel, and visitor management; and
- 3. Applicant's or its owners' experience conducting or supporting or plans to conduct institutional review board-approved research involving human subjects that is related to medical cannabis or substance abuse, where the value of past or ongoing clinical research with IRB approval shall outweigh plans to conduct such research, whether the applicant has had any assurance accepted by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services indicating the applicant's commitment to complying with 45 CFR Part 46, and whether the applicant has a research collaboration or partnership agreement in effect with an accredited U.S. school of medicine or osteopathic medicine with experience conducting cannabis-related research;
- Applicant's or its owners' demonstrated commitment to the community and social responsibility; or sufficient evidence related to N.J.A.C. 17:30-30-7.10 (a)(13);
- 5. Summary of the applicant's environmental impact and sustainability plan; whether the applicant entity or its parent company has any recognitions from or registrations with federal or New Jersey state environmental regulators for innovation in sustainability; and whether the applicant entity or its parent company holds any certification under international standards demonstrating the applicant has an effective environmental management system or has a designated sustainability officer to conduct internal audits to assess the effective implementation of an environmental management system;
- Applicant's ties to the host community, including, for Standard License applications, the Applicant's willingness to enter into a Community Benefit Agreement;
- Applicant's demonstrated commitment to diversity in its ownership composition and hiring practices and whether the applicant entity or its parent company holds any certifications as a Camden-owned Business, New Jersey MBE, WBE, DVBE, VBE or SBE;
- Social Equity Businesses, Diversely Owned Businesses and Impact Zone Businesses shall always have priority over other license applicants;
- Conditional license applicants shall always have priority over annual license applicants;
- Micro-Business license applicants shall always have priority over standard cannabis business license applicants;
- Microbusinesses that are also Impact Zone businesses shall always have priority over other Micro-businesses; and
- License applicants given bonus points pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-6.1(d) shall have priority over license applicants with no bonus points.

- i. A notification of award and conditional municipal license shall entitle the recipient applicant to pursue a State permit or license in the appropriate classification for up to 12 months. No license to operate shall issue until the applicant has received a State permit and satisfied other prerequisites of municipal licensure. If the recipient of a notice of award and conditional license has not received a State permit or license within 12 months from issuance, the Administrator shall issue a new request for applications and evaluate all applicants for licensure under the above criteria.
- j. In addition to complying with any State requirement related to good character and criminal background, any person proposed to have an ownership interest in the license shall not have had any cannabis license or permit revoked for a violation affecting public safety in the State of New Jersey or a subdivision thereof within the preceding 3 years.
- k. Term of license and license renewals.
 - Any local license issued pursuant to this Chapter shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from the date of issuance and shall be renewed yearly in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter.
 - The Business Administrator may, at his/her discretion, adjust the renewal date of the local license to correlate with an applicant's State licensing and renewal schedule.
 - Renewal of any license shall be governed by any amendments to state law, regulations and/or the City of Camden Code.
 - Transfer of ownership of any local license or change of location of any license or modification to expand a licensed premise shall be subject to approval by the City Zoning Officer.
 - 5. Except where the Business Administrator has received a complete renewal application along with the requisite fees, and has issued a license renewal, it shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, sell, distribute, transfer, transport, or otherwise remove cannabis or cannabis products from the premises of any license after the expiration date recorded on the face of the license.

E. Fees.

- 1. The following fees shall apply to all cannabis businesses:
 - a. Micro-Businesses:
 - 1. Application Fee \$2500.00
 - 2. Annual Renewal Fee \$2500.00
 - b. Standard Businesses [Non-Micro-Business]:
 - 1. Application Fee \$5000.00
 - 2. Annual Renewal Fee \$5000.00
 - c. The above fees shall be submitted to the City at the time the cannabis business submits its Initial application or the renewal application to the City. If the cannabis business's application is denied, the City shall refund eighty percent (80%) of the Initial Application or Renewal Fee if the applicant is not approved for a cannabis license by the State of New Jersey.

F. Disciplinary Actions; Sanctions; Penalties

1. Disciplinary actions. Procedures for investigation of license violations and for suspension, revocation, or other licensing sanctions as a result of any such violation shall be as follows:

a. First offense:

Up to \$500 per violation per day;

b. Second offense:

Up to \$1000 per violation per day;

c. Third offense:

Up to \$2500 per violation per day;

- d. Fourth violation shall result in a summary suspension.
- 2. Summary suspension. Notwithstanding the foregoing section, when the Business Administrator has reasonable grounds to believe that a licensee has engaged in a willful violation of any applicable law, regulation or City of Camden Code provision, or that the public health, safety, and/or general welfare has been jeopardized and requires emergency action, the Business Administrator may enter a summary suspension order for the immediate suspension of such license pending further investigation.
 - a. The summary suspension order shall be in writing and shall State the reasons therefore. The licensee shall be afforded an opportunity for a hearing as outlined herein.
 - b. The Business Administrator shall convene a review panel consisting of the Business Administrator, a second administrative officer designated by the Mayor, and an officer designated by the Chief of Police. The hearing shall be scheduled within 30 days of the date of the order.
 - c. The review panel is authorized to impose any fines, conditions, restrictions, suspensions, or combination thereof authorized by the State of New Jersey. The City may issue fines up to, but not to exceed, \$2,500 per offense and/or suspension of license for a period not to exceed 6 months.
- Inactive licenses. Following the commencement of retail sales of cannabis or cannabis
 products, the Business Administrator may suspend or revoke any license if the licensed
 premises have been inactive or unoccupied by the licensee for at least 6 months.
 - 4. State license. The Business Administrator may suspend or revoke any license if the corresponding State license or permit for the subject location is expired, surrendered, suspended, or revoked.

G. SITE PLAN REVIEW REQUIREMENTS

 The City's Zoning Officer will review and determine whether any proposed Cannabis establishment requires approval from the Zoning Board of Adjustment and or Planning Board through the Zoning permit approval process.

H. SIGNAGE AND DISPLAY OF PRODUCTS

- 1. Each business shall be permitted 2 signs.
- 2. Signs shall be limited to location identification/name of business.
- 3. Signs shall not promote consumption of any cannabis product.
- Signage design shall not include artistic or photographic renderings of cannabis plants or paraphernalia.
- 5. Neon signs shall be prohibited.
- The following words shall be prohibited from appearing on any sign: "pot" and "weed"
- Signage shall comply with the City's Signage Ordinance, as may be amended from time to time.
- 8. No cannabis products shall be displayed in any windows or doors.

I. DISTANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Cannabis Businesses; All Classes.

- a. In addition to any other requirements and limitations established by the Commission from time to time, no cannabis business, including an Alternative Treatment Center seeking Class 1 through Class 5 licenses herein shall be located within:
 - 1. Two hundred feet from any public or non-public school, licensed child-care facility, park, or playground, behavioral health facility as measured in a straight line from the nearest two (2) points of the property lines.
 - 2. Two hundred feet of the property line of any existing church or house of worship, as measured in a straight line from the nearest two (2) points of the property lines.
 - 3. Two hundred feet of any other retail cannabis business as measured in a straight line from the nearest two (2) points of the property lines.
 - b. In addition to any other requirements and limitations established by the Commission from time to time, no cannabis business, including an Alternative Treatment Center seeking Class 1 through Class 5 licenses herein shall be located in any residential zone.

J. Requirements for Cannabis Businesses

1. All Cannabis Businesses

- There shall be no on-site sales of alcohol or tobacco products, and no on-site consumption of food, alcohol, tobacco, or cannabis by patrons.
- b. For any licensed cultivation, processing, manufacturing, or similar operation, the facility shall provide an air treatment system with sufficient odor absorbing ventilation and exhaust systems such that any odors generated inside the facility are not detectable by a person of reasonable sensitivity anywhere on adjacent property, within public rights of way, or within any other unit located within the same building as the licensed facility if the use only occupies a portion of a building.
- c. For any licensed cultivation, processing, manufacturing, or similar operation, the facility shall provide for noise mitigation features designed to minimize disturbance from machinery, processing and/or packaging operations, loading, and other noise generating equipment or machinery. All licensed facilities must operate within applicable State decibel limitations.
- No outside storage of any cannabis, cannabis products, or cannabis paraphernalia shall be permitted.
- All licensed cannabis facilities shall have a round-the-clock video surveillance system, 365 days a year.
- f. Video surveillance shall be retained a minimum of seven (7) days or pursuant to State and Federal law, whichever is greater.
- g. All licensed facilities must provide the Camden County Police Department, Metro Division, with access to security footage immediately upon request by the Department.
- h. All licensed facilities must provide at least one licensed security guard (or more if required by the State) during all times the facility is open to the public.
- For any licensed cultivation operation, the facility must avoid lighting spillover into any residential neighborhoods, and must comply with all applicable State lighting limitations.
- As applicable and to the fullest extent possible, all licensed facilities must provide for adequate buffering as otherwise required by City of Camden Ordinance.

All cannabis establishments shall conduct business and operations indoors.

2. Cannabis Retailers; Class 5.

- a. In addition to the above, Cannabis Retailers, including an Alternative Treatment Center seeking a Retail license herein must also meet the following requirements:
- A cannabis retailer may operate between the hours of 9:00
 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. Monday through Saturday and between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on Sunday.
- No more than one (1) ounce of cannabis or cannabis product may be sold to a specific customer at a given time.
- Use or consumption of cannabis or cannabis products in any manner shall not be permitted within the Cannabis Retailer's facility, whether in the building or on its grounds or parking lots. Cannabis Consumption Areas are not permitted.
- 4. All Cannabis Retailers shall be enclosed in heated/air-conditioned permanent buildings, not trailers, outdoors, movable kiosks, etc.
- 5. Any Cannabis Retailer shall only have one (1) primary public access point, which shall be directly adjacent to the right-of-way or parking area of the building. Access should not be through common entrances with other uses.
 - 6. Drive-through facilities are not permitted.
- All cannabis retailers shall be secured in accordance with State of New Jersey statutes and regulations; shall have a round-theclock video surveillance system, 365 days a year.
- 8. At least one (1) licensed security guard shall be onsite at all times during a retail cannabis business's hours of operation. All patrons must be screened by said security employee and patrons must demonstrate proof of minimum age (21 years old).
- 9. Cannabis Retailers' interiors shall provide a secure location for storage of products with minimum products in any customer service area.
- 10. People shall not be permitted to congregate outside of a Cannabis Retailer, loiter or wait in line to access the Cannabis Retailer. The facility shall have a plan in place if interior capacity is exceeded, i.e., numbers are given and customers wait in their vehicles until called.
- 3. Cannabis Delivery License; Class 6. Any law enforcement officer of the Camden County Police Department or any officer of the City's Code Enforcement Department may request that cannabis business personnel performing a transport or delivery to present a Cannabis Business Identification Card or a copy of a transport order or delivery request.

K. PARKING AND LOADING

1. Retail:

a. <u>Number of Parking Spaces</u>: A retail cannabis business establishment shall be required to provide no less than 1 parking space per 250 square feet of gross floor area.

- b. <u>Regulations</u>: Retail cannabis businesses also shall follow the parking regulations set forth in the Camden City Code unless such establishments are located within an area governed by a redevelopment plan, in which case the parking standards set forth in the redevelopment plan shall control.
- c. Off-site Arrangements: Parking requirements may be satisfied through an off-site parking arrangement.

2. All Other Cannabis Businesses:

- a. <u>Number of Parking Spaces</u>: All non-retail cannabis businesses shall be required to provide no less than 1 space per 1000 square feet of gross floor area.
- Regulations: All non-retail cannabis businesses also shall follow the parking regulations set forth in the Camden City Code.

3. Loading Requirements:

- a. <u>Retail</u>: A retail cannabis business establishment shall adhere to the Camden City Code regarding required loading areas for commercial uses.
- All Other Cannabis Businesses: All non-retail cannabis businesses shall adhere to the Camden City Code regarding required loading areas for light industrial and warehouses.

L. ODOR MITIGATION/SMOKING

- All cannabis businesses must provide adequate HVAC air quality equipment.
- Cannabis odor must not permeate outside any cannabis business establishment.
- All cannabis businesses shall adhere to generally applicable City ordinances regulating odor emissions and environmental impacts.
- All retail cannabis businesses must follow the protocols set forth in the Clean Air Act.
- 5. All cannabis cultivators must provide a water mitigation plan.
- No smoking is permitted inside or outside of any cannabis business establishment.

M. NOISE MITIGATION

- 1.All cannabis businesses shall adhere to all generally applicable noise ordinances, nuisance ordinances, other Camden City Code requirements and all other state and federal requirements.
- 2.All non-retail cannabis businesses shall take such sound mitigation practices as may be necessary, including but not limited to the installation of insulation if appropriate.
- All non-retail cannabis businesses shall adhere to the requirements of N.J.A.C.
 7:29.

N. HOURS OF OPERATION

- <u>Retail</u>: The maximum hours of operation for any retail cannabis business shall be as stated herein.
- All Other Cannabis Businesses: All non-retail cannabis businesses shall adhere
 to the generally applicable hours of operation for manufacturing and light
 industrial businesses within the City.

O. CAPACITY

- Retail: A maximum of 10 patrons per 250 square feet of gross floor area shall be
 permitted in any retail cannabis business establishment. By way of clarification, floor
 area which is not accessible to customers (e.g., storage) shall not be included in the gross
 floor area for purposes of this calculation. The business's security employees shall
 monitor patron capacity and restrict entry if necessary.
- All Other Cannabis Businesses: The capacity of all non-retail cannabis businesses shall be governed by the generally applicable requirements for manufacturing and light industrial businesses within the City.

P. CONSUMPTION, POSSESSION, NUISANCE AND UNREGULATED SALE

- Consumption of any cannabis products in any cannabis business establishment and in any
 other business establishment is prohibited.
- 2. Prohibition in Public Places No person shall consume, use, smoke, vape, aerosolize, imbibe or possess in any open container any cannabis or cannabis product in or upon public or quasi-public place.
- 3. Prohibition in Vehicles No person shall consume, use, smoke, vape, aerosolize, imbibe any cannabis or cannabis products in or upon any private vehicle while the vehicle is in motion or parked upon any such public or quasi-public place.
- 4. Other Prohibitions No person shall consume cannabis items through smoking, vaping or aerosolizing in any place that any other law prohibits the smoking of tobacco, including N.J.S.A. 2C:33-13 and the "New Jersey Smoke-Free Air Act," N.J.S.A. 26:3D-55 et seq.
- 5. Prohibition of Unregulated Sale of Cannabis
 - a. No person shall sell cannabis in the City of Camden without a state license and a valid City permit.
 - b. No person shall gift cannabis in the City of Camden as part of a sale of another item or items.
- 6. Nuisance It shall be deemed a nuisance if a person who is consuming, using, smoking, vaping, aerosolizing or imbibing cannabis shall permit excessive odor or other pollution to extend beyond the person's premises.

Q. CONDITIONAL USES

- 1. The following conditional uses may be permitted when authorized by the Planning Board and or Zoning Board of Adjustment as provided for by this Chapter:
 - Cultivation
 - b. Manufacture
 - c. Wholesale
 - d. Distribution
 - e. Cannabis Retailer

R. Area and Yard Requirements.

- 1. Class 2, Class 3 & Class 4 shall have minimum lot area of 2.5 acres.
- Total building or structure coverage shall not exceed 50% of the lot coverage provided all parking and other yard requirements are met.
- Retailer Class 5 the minimum lot area shall have a range from 1,000 to 40,000 square feet as determined by the Zoning Officer.

S. Transfer and User Tax

1. Purpose. - It is the purpose of this Article to implement the provisions of the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement, Assistance and Marketplace Modernization Act which authorizes a municipality to impose Cannabis Transfer and User Taxes. The definitions and

other provisions of the Act and N.J.A.C. 17:30 are hereby incorporated herein. Any amendments to the Act and N.J.A.C. 17:30-1.2 are also incorporated herein without the need to revise this Chapter.

- a. Transfer Tax
 - 1. There shall be a transfer tax imposed on the receipts from the sale of cannabis and cannabis items from the following licensed person or entity located in this municipality:
 - a. From a cannabis cultivator to another cannabis cultivator; and
 - b. From one cannabis establishment to another cannabis establishment; and
 - c. From a cannabis retailer to retail consumers who are 21 years of age or older; and
 - d. By any combination thereof.
 - 2. The transfer tax rates imposed on the sales of cannabis shall not exceed 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis cultivator; 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis manufacturer; 1% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis wholesaler; and 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis retailer.
 - The transfer tax shall be in addition to any other tax or fee imposed pursuant to statute or local ordinance or resolution by any governmental entity with regard to cannabis.
- 4. Any transaction for which the transfer tax is imposed, is exempt from the tax imposed under the "Sales and Use Tax Act", except for those which generate receipts from the retail sales by cannabis retailers.
- 5. The transfer tax shall be stated, charged and shown separately on any sales slip, invoice, receipt or other statement or memorandum of the price paid or payable or equivalent value of the transfer for the cannabis or cannabis item.
- 6. The transfer tax shall not apply to transfers involving distributors for purposes of bulk transportation.
 - 7. The transfer tax shall not apply to delivery services to consumers.
- b. User Tax
- 1. There shall be a user tax imposed on any concurrent license holder operating more than one cannabis establishment.
- 2. The user tax rate shall be the same rate as the transfer tax above: The user tax rates imposed on the sales of cannabis shall not exceed 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis cultivator; 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis manufacturer; 1% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis wholesaler; and 2% of the receipts from each sale by a cannabis retailer.
- 3. The user tax shall be imposed on the value of each transfer or use of cannabis or cannabis items not otherwise subject to the transfer tax imposed on the license holder's establishment that is located in the municipality to any of the other license holder's establishments, whether located in this municipality or any other municipality.
 - 4. The user tax shall be in addition to any other tax or fee imposed pursuant to statute or local ordinance or resolution by any governmental entity with regard to cannabis.
 - 5. Any transaction for which the user tax is imposed, is exempt from the tax imposed under the "Sales and Use Tax Act", except for those which generate receipts from the retail sales by cannabis retailers.
 - 6. The user tax shall be stated, charged and shown separately on any sales slip, invoice, receipt or other statement or memorandum of the price paid or payable or equivalent value of the transfer for the cannabis or cannabis item.

- 1. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:48I-1, section 40, every cannabis establishment required to collect the transfer and user taxes imposed by this Chapter shall be personally liable for the transfer and user tax imposed, collected, or required by this Chapter and under N.J.S.A. 40:48I-1, section 40.
- 2. Any cannabis establishment collecting a transfer tax or user tax shall have the same right with respect to collecting the tax from another cannabis establishment or the consumer as if the tax was a part of the sale and payable at the same time or with respect to non-payment of the transfer tax or user tax by the cannabis establishment or consumer, as if the tax was part of the purchase price of the cannabis or cannabis item and payable at the same time, provided that the Finance Director of the City of Camden which imposes the transfer tax and user tax is joined as a party in any action or proceeding brought to collect the transfer tax or user tax.
- 3. No cannabis establishment required to collect the transfer and user taxes imposed by this Chapter shall advertise or hold out to any person or to the public in general, in any manner, directly or indirectly, that the transfer tax or user tax will not be separately charged and stated to another cannabis establishment or the consumer or that the transfer tax or user tax will be refunded to the cannabis establishment or the consumer.
- 4. Each cannabis establishment collecting transfer and user taxes pursuant to this chapter shall be remitted to the Finance Director of the City of Camden on a monthly basis.
- 5. Delinquent taxes. If a Licensee is a Lessee of the parcel of the real property comprising the cannabis establishment premises, and the Licensee/Lessee becomes delinquent in submitting either the transfer or user taxes for more than 30 days, the City may refer the Licensee/Lessee to the Business Administrator [or Committee] to consider any actions to be taken, including but not limited to, penalties to be imposed, suspension of the license, disallowance of a license renewal or any other remedies allowed by law.
- 6. If the Licensee is the owner of the parcel of real property comprising the cannabis establishment premises, and if the transfer tax or user tax is not paid when due, the unpaid balance, and any interest accruing thereon, shall be a lien on the parcel of real property comprising the cannabis establishment's premises. The annual City license issued pursuant to this Chapter hall not be renewed for the cannabis establishment should any transfer or user tax pursuant to this Chapter be delinquent.
- 7. The lien shall be superior and paramount to the interest in the parcel of any owner, lessee, tenant, mortgagee, or other person, except the lien of municipal taxes, and shall be on a parity with and deemed equal to the municipal lien on the parcel for unpaid property taxes due and owing in the same year.
- 8. The City shall file with the Tax Collector, a statement showing the amount and due date of the unpaid balance of cannabis taxes and identifying the lot and block number of the parcel of real property that comprises the delinquent cannabis establishment's premises. The lien shall be enforced as a municipal lien in the same manner as all other municipal liens are enforced.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that following introduction and prior to adoption, the Clerk shall cause a copy of this ordinance to be referred to the City of Camden Planning Board for review pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40:55D-26.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any portion of the City Code not herein amended and supplemented shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance. Furthermore, the other provisions of this ordinance are deemed to be severable and remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23 and N.J.S.A. 40:69A-41, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Mayor, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to approve or veto this Ordinance. Additionally, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the State Commissioner of Community Affairs, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to veto this Ordinance, and the action by the Commissioner regarding this Ordinance shall supersede any action by the Mayor on the same Ordinance. All notices of approval and/or veto shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2022 TAX AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CAMDEN AND SOUTH JERSEY PORT CORPORATION

WHEREAS, the City of Camden desires to enter into a Tax Agreement with the South Jersey Port Corporation for fiscal year 2022; and

WHEREAS, the South Jersey Port Corporation has agreed to pay the City of Camden Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) for fiscal year 2022 as a payment in lieu of taxes pursuant to N.J.S.A 12:11A-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Camden to enter into a Tax Agreement with South Jersey Port Corporation; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Camden that it hereby authorizes the proper officials of the City of Camden to enter into a Tax Agreement with the South Jersey Port Corporation for fiscal year 2022, for the amount of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Camden is authorized to accept Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) from the South Jersey Port Corporation pursuant to the within Tax Agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23, a true copy of this Resolution shall be forwarded to the State Commissioner of Community Affairs, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to veto this Resolution. All notices of veto shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

FISCAL YEAR 2022 TAX AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

CITY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY

AND

SOUTH JERSEY PORT CORPORATION

THIS TA	X AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as the "Tax Agreement") made this	
day of	, 2021 by and between the CITY OF CAMDEN, a body corporate	MBZ
and politic of the	State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as the "City") and the SOUTH	
JERSEY PORT	CORPORATION (hereinafter referred to as the "Port Corporation").	

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter Sixty of the Laws of 1968 of the State of New Jersey, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), the State of New Jersey ("State") granted the Port Corporation full power and authority to purchase, construct, lease and operate marine terminals within the South Jersey Port District, which includes the City; and

WHEREAS, the Port Corporation has, and will in the future, enter into various agreements, whereby they have, and will in the future, acquire title to real property within the City in furtherance of said purpose and in exercise of its powers; and

WHEREAS, the exercise of the power granted to the Port Corporation will be, in all respects, for the benefit of the people of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2021 Tax Agreement between the Port Corporation and the City expires on December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City's fiscal year 2022 begins January 1, 2022 and ends December, 31,

2022; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Port Corporation wish to provide for a 2022 Tax

Agreement based on the City's fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the parties to this Tax Agreement have agreed to a fair and reasonable sum in order to compensate the City of said loss of tax revenues and enable it to provide for services to its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO FOR THEMSELVES, THEIR SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS MUTUALLY UNDERTAKE, COVENANT AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Port Corporation agrees to pay to the City for the fiscal year 2022 the sum of \$4,000,000 (the "Pilot Payment") and the City hereby agrees to accept the Pilot Payment pursuant to the Act, said sum in lieu of any and all City taxes and assessments on all property now owned or hereafter acquired by the Port Corporation during the term of this Agreement.

Section 2. The above Pilot Payment shall be paid not later than May 1, 2022.

Section 3. In consideration of Port Corporation's making the above \$4,000,000 Pilot Payment for the fiscal year 2022, City hereby agrees to release the Port Corporation and waive City's rights to collect from Port Corporation any tax payments through and including December 31, 2022. Notwithstanding the above release, if the State of New Jersey decides to fund through appropriations any prior year(s)' payment in lieu of taxes, then the Port will cooperate to pay such amount consistent with a Tax Agreement which will be negotiated at that time.

Section 4. City hereby agrees and acknowledges that the payment by Port

Corporation of the Pilot Payment for the year(s) covered by this agreement is subject to and

conditioned upon an appropriation from the Legislature of the State of New Jersey and transmittal of such funds to SJPC and further that no liability shall occur to Port Corporation if such appropriation shall not be made or such funds transmitted to SJPC.

Section 5. The above payment shall be devoted by the City solely to such purpose to which taxes may be applied, unless and until otherwise directed by the Laws of the State of New Jersey. Payments shall be made payable to the Treasurer of the City of Camden and checks shall be made payable to his or her order.

Section 6. During the term of this Tax Agreement from the date of acquisition of each particular parcel by the Port Corporation, and for so long thereafter as the Port Corporation shall own real property, the City shall mark the said property exempt on its tax records with a notation that such entry is made pursuant to this Tax Agreement.

Section 7. The Port Corporation shall establish and maintain a special fund called the "South Jersey Port Corporation Tax Reserve Fund," hereinafter referred to as "Fund" in which there shall be deposited: (a) monies appropriated therefore by the State, as described in Section 8 below; (b) proceeds of bonds or notes required to be deposited therein by the terms of any contract between the Port Corporation and the bondholders or note holders; and (c) other monies deposited therein by the Port Corporation. Monies in the Fund shall be held and applied solely to the payment of tax payments which the Port Corporation is obligated to pay as the same become due and payable and shall not be withdrawn therefrom if such withdrawal would reduce the amount in such fund to less than the Property Tax Reserve, as defined in Section 20(b) of the Act.

Section 8. The obligations of the Port Corporation to make any tax payments from its

funds or monies (other than from monies in the Fund) shall be at all times subject to prior use and application of funds and monies of the Port Corporation to provide for its operating and maintenance expenses and reserve therefore and for the payment of principal, interest and retirement of bonds and reserves and securities therefore as provided in any contract with holders of its bonds, pursuant to the Act.

Section 9. To assure the provision of the payment of the monies hereunder and funding of the Property Tax Reserve, the Chairman of the PORT CORPORATION shall annually make and deliver to the Governor, his certification stating the sum, if any, needed to provide in said fund the amount of the property tax reserve as of said date. The PORT CORPORATION shall not be required to make payments and no interest shall accrue under the within agreement until 30 days from the time as there has been annually appropriated and paid to the corporation for deposit in the property tax reserve fund such sums as certified by the Chairman of the PORT CORPORATION pursuant to N.J.S.A. 12:11A-20b; or unless funds otherwise have been deposited in said property tax reserve fund as provided by statute and referred to above; or unless the PORT CORPORATION otherwise has funds available from the profits of its business operations, defined as net proceeds remaining after operating expenses and the other priority obligations under the act and bond resolutions have been met.

Section 10. The term of this Tax Agreement shall be for the period commencing January 1, 2022 and terminating December 31, 2022.

Section 11. It is expressly understood and agreed between the City and the Port

Corporation that, by the execution of this Tax Agreement and receipt of the sums provided for

herein, the obligations of the Port Corporation and the City pursuant to Section 20(b) of the Act,

N.J.S.A. 12:11A-20(b), relating to the issuance of bonds or notes of the Port Corporation, are hereby satisfied for the period through December 31, 2021.

Section 12. In the event that any of the property currently owned by the Port

Corporation is conveyed during the term of this Tax Agreement by the Port Corporation to a

non-exempt owner or to the State, or an agency thereof, the United States Government or any
agency thereof, or to the Delaware River Port Authority, the amount to be paid under this Tax

Agreement by the Port Corporation shall be reduced. The amount of such reduction shall be the
same percentage that the value of the property so conveyed is as to the total value of all the
property, based on the present assessment for that premises, applied to the annual payment. In
the event that the parties cannot agree as to the percentage of value, said percentage shall be
determined by the average of two appraisals, both of which shall be made by members of the
Appraisal Institute. Each party shall be entitled to select on M.A.I. appraiser and each party shall
pay the appraiser selected by it.

Section 13. In consideration for the Pilot Payments, City hereby further agrees to discharge of record all outstanding tax liens or judgments which accrued during the Port Corporation's ownership of any property.

Section 14. Neither the members of the Port Corporation nor any individual officer or official of the Port Corporation or the City, nor any agent or employee of either of the parties hereto shall be charged personally by any of the others with any liability, nor held liable to either of the parties hereto under any terms, provisions or sections of this Tax Agreement, or because of its execution, attempted execution of any breach hereof.

Section 15. This Tax Agreement constitutes the entire agreement among the parties for

the 2022 Fiscal Year. It is expressly understood and agreed that this Tax Agreement may not be altered, amended, modified, or otherwise changed in any respect or particular whatsoever except in writing duly executed by the authorized representative of the party or parties to be charged.

Section 16. This Tax Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey. In the event any section or provision of this Tax Agreement, or the application of any such sections or provision, shall be held by a tribunal of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to law, the remaining sections or provisions of this Tax Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

Mayors of Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ) municipalities:

On August 17th, 2021, Lt. Governor Sheila Oliver (in the absence of Governor Phil Murphy) signed a bill into law making significant changes to the Urban Enterprise Zone Program, one of which allocated \$42.5 Million Dollars (\$42,500,000.00) to the Zone Assistance Fund (ZAF). Shortly thereafter, I sent out to UEZ Coordinators statewide a number of items (copy of new law and resolutions, initial zone allocations, etc.) deemed pertinent to the process of making sure that the 32 respective zones (37 municipalities) had the information needed to begin the process of submitting economic development projects of their choosing for UEZA Board approval by an anticipated date of February 2022.

It has been brought to our attention at the Division that a number of zones have been hesitant to proceed with the process of accessing allocated funding because of some question as to whether there were some additional factors required to move forward, that is not the case. This is not a rumor of proposed funding but instead is law, available for public view.

The purpose of this memorandum is to settle once and for all any question as to whether the UEZ program has received funding (made available by the submission of projects proposed by local municipalities confirmed with a resolution) allowing access to funding by submitting a request via SAGE to the UEZA Board. Once Divisional staff has checked the proposal for compliance, it is then forwarded to the UEZ Project Manager to be scheduled for an upcoming Board meeting (future meetings will most likely be monthly, based on anticipated volume).

FY 2022 ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET

The Urban Enterprise Zone Assistance Fund assist qualified municipalities in which enterprise zones are designated in undertaking public improvements and in upgrading eligible municipal services and Administrative Budgets in designated enterprise zones.

The governing body of the above-mentioned municipality, a qualified municipality in which an enterprise zone is designated, and the local Zone Boundaries created by the participating municipality for said zone have, by resolution jointly adopted after public hearing, proposed to request the following UEZ Administrative Budget for Fiscal Year 2022. The monies; therefore, are deposited in the Enterprise Zone Assistance Fund. ZAF will credited to the account of the municipality's said account maintained by the State Treasurer for the Enterprise Zone.

The Establishment Clause of the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution prohibits the government from directly funding religious activity. Zone assistance funds allocated to this project are not used in any manner that would violate the Establishment Clause. Goods and services purchased under this project will be secular and not ideological. If requested by the UEZ Authority, said municipality will promptly deliver to the UEZ Authority a written opinion of said municipality's legal counsel opining that any particular use of zone assistance funds identified by the UEZ Authority does not violate the Establishment Clause. Further, zone assistance funds allocated to this project will not be used to pay any expenditures that are required to be reported pursuant to the N.J. Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act.

A. Organizational Background:

The Camden City Urban Enterprise Zone Program is under the auspices of the City government Department of Development and Planning.

Joe Thomas, the Economic Development Rep., oversees the administration of the Business Growth Development Team in the City of Camden. The Business Growth Development Team is a synergetic team comprised of the Director of Planning for the City of Camden, the Director of the City of Camden Redevelopment Agency, the Urban Enterprise Zone Coordinator, an Administrative Analyst Grant Applications, City Attorney and Code Enforcement Director

The mission of the BGDT is to increase tax retables by attracting new businesses, facilitating the expansion of existing businesses and fostering industry based family sustaining jobs within Camden City. As such, it functions as the single point of contact for all, remediation and marketing with business growth

WHEREAS, Joseph's House of Camden has submitted a proposal in response to the City's Request for Proposals (RFP#21-26) which will provide emergency warming center services for the City of Camden's homeless population when the Camden County Health Officer declares a "Code Blue Emergency" for freezing weather conditions from December 15, 2021 to approximately April 30, 2022 for \$250.00 per day/night in the amount not to exceed THIRTY-ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$31,250.00); and

1800 Davis Associates, LLC, the developer and an affiliate of Michaels Development Company is partnering with Virtua Health to finance the development of a senior affordable housing development that will revitalize an approximately one-acre site in the City of Camden located at 1800 Davis Street, Block 1395, Lot 39 on the City of Camden's tax map in the Whitman Park neighborhood (the "Project") which is owned by the Camden Redevelopment Agency. PROJECT NARRATIVE

Virtua Health Redevelopment is a planned senior affordable housing development that will revitalize an approximately one-acre site within the City of Camden (located at 1800 Davis Street, Block 1395, Lot 39 on the City's official tax map) and the Whitman Park Neighborhood. The Site is currently occupied by a blighted and vacant 40,000 SF office building and surface parking lot. The office building will be demolished in order to construct a 4-story mixed-use structure with an attached parking garage. The ground floor of the new building will feature common and primary medical office space. The upper three stories will consist of 50 dwelling units: 49 low-income rental units and 1 superintendent's unit.

1800 David Associates, LLC, the developer and an affiliate of Michaels Development Company is partnering with Virtua Health, the largest healthcare provider in Southern New Jersey, to finance the development. Virtua will provide a \$4MM soft loan to the project, with a matching contribution from the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency through its Hospital Partnership Subsidy Program. Equity capital will be sourced from syndicated federal Low-Income Housing Tax Credits

The planned unit mix consists of 43 one-bedroom/one-bathroom units averaging 669 gross square feet and 7 two-bedroom/one-bathroom units averaging 890 gross square feet. Units will be income-restricted to no more than 60% of area median income. Ten (10) units will be set aside for homeless individuals. Occupancy of the revenue units will be restricted to individuals aged 55 and older.

Each apartment will feature a full kitchen with abundant cabinet space, living and dining areas, full baths, generous bedroom dimensions, ample closet space as well as Energy Star-rated appliances, including frost-free refrigerator, dishwasher, and range hood. Energy-efficient heating and cooling systems that meet the Energy Star Program requirements will be installed in every dwelling unit. Residents will be responsible for household heating, hot water, and electric expenses. The building will be elevator-loaded with common corridors and include on-site laundry facilities as well as approximately 2,400 SF of community space and property management and maintenance team workspace.

All residents of Virtua Health Redevelopment will benefit from free access to on-site social services. Additionally, Virtua Health will operate a 5,000 SF qualified federal health center on the ground floor of the development.

ORDINANCE GRANTING THE APPLICATION OF CAMDEN HOTEL PARTNERS, LLC FOR A LOCAL ECONOMIC REDEVELOPMENT AND GROWTH GRANT PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A LOCAL ECONOMIC REDEVELOPMENT AND GROWTH GRANT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Legislature has adopted P.L. 2013, c. 161, known as the Economic Opportunity Act of 2013 ("EOA"), for the purpose of revitalizing the State of New Jersey, including the City of Camden; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d, the EOA authorizes the governing body of a municipality, wherein is located a qualifying economic redevelopment and growth grant incentive area, to establish a local Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant program ("Local ERG Program") for the purpose of encouraging redevelopment projects in that area through the provision of incentive grants to reimburse developers for all or a portion of the project financing gap for such projects; and

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2016, the City Council of the City of Camden adopted Ordinance MC-5016, entitled "Ordinance Establishing a Local Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant Program pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d;" and

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2017, the City Council of the City of Camden amended Ordinance MC-5016, entitled "Ordinance Establishing a Local Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant Program pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d;" to change the percentage from 85 to 75; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 2017, the City Council of the City of Camden adopted Resolution MC-17:5653, authorizing submission of an application to the New Jersey Local Finance Board ("LFB"), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d, for approval of Ordinance MC-5016 establishing the Local ERG Program; and

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2017, the Local Finance Board, in the Division of Local Government Services, in the Department of Community Affairs ("Local Finance Board"), approved Ordinance MC-5016 authorizing the establishment of the local Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant program in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d; and

WHEREAS, Camden Hotel Partners, LLC is proposing to construct an eight-story, 180-key hotel on a 19,110 square foot parcel with ground floor retail space (the "Project") on property formally identified as Block 81.02, Lot 1, Unit H-1, on the City of Camden Tax Map and located on Cooper Street, between Riverside Drive and new Caruso Place within the Downtown Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, Camden Hotel Partners, LLC has submitted an application for approval of a local incentive grant under the City's Local ERG Program and has represented that the grant is necessary to provide gap financing required to move the Project forward; and

WHEREAS, Camden Hotel Partners, LLC has also submitted an application for approval of a State Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant, which application received approval from the New Jersey Economic Development Authority ("NJEDA") Board on June 13, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the City has submitted a copy of Camden Hotel Partners, LLC's application for approval of a local incentive grant under the City's Local ERG Program to the NJEDA for the completion of the fiscal analysis, completion of the net positive economic benefits test, and recommendation on the application; and

WHEREAS, the City has submitted an application to the Local Finance Board for review and approval of Camden Hotel Partner, LLC's application for a local incentive grant under the City's Local ERG Program, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489d.c; and

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the Camden Hotel Partners, LLC application for the Project and finds that it is consistent with the eligibility requirements of the EOA and the City's Local ERG Program; and

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of approving the Camden Hotel Partners, LLC application for a local incentive grant under the City's Local ERG Program in order to encourage the aforementioned Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Camden, that:

SECTION 1. The Local ERG Program application of Camden Hotel Partners, LLC for a local incentive grant for the development of an eight-story, 180-key hotel on property identified as Block 81.02, Lot 1, Unit H-1, on the City of Camden Tax Map is hereby granted.

SECTION 2. The local incentive grant shall be funded by the municipal hotel and motel room occupancy tax, as established by the City Council of the City of Camden, pursuant to Ordinance MC-5015, adopted on December 13, 2016, and as authorized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48F-1, et seq. in a maximum amount of up to 75% of the incremental local revenues collected, or approximately \$1,415,472, over a maximum reimbursement term of twenty (20) years, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-489g. The base amount of the combined reimbursements under the Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant Agreements with the State or City of Camden shall in no event exceed forty (40) percent of the total eligible project costs.

SECTION 3. The Council does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor of the City of Camden to execute, on behalf of the Municipality, an Economic Redevelopment and Growth Grant Agreement for the Project consistent with the terms of this Ordinance and the Local ERG Program.

SECTION 4. Any portion of this ordinance not herein amended and supplemented shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts or ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 7. If any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this ordinance. Furthermore, the other provisions of this ordinance are deemed to be severable and remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23 and N.J.S.A. 40:69A-41, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Mayor, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to approve or veto this Ordinance. Additionally, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27BBB-23, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the State Commissioner of Community Affairs, who shall have ten (10) days from the receipt thereof to veto this Ordinance, and the action by the Commissioner regarding this Ordinance shall supersede any action by the Mayor on the same Ordinance. All notices of approval and/or veto shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.
