HADDON AVENUE IMPROVEMENTS

CONSTRUCTION

Newton Avenue to Euclid Avenue

Transportation improvements are coming to Haddon Avenue!

Haddon Avenue (County Route 561), between Newton Avenue (County Route 604) and Euclid Avenue, will be improved to serve all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, transit riders, and motorists, as part of a multi-phase upgrade plan for the corridor. Initiated by the City of Camden and Camden County and shaped by community input, this project reflects a shared commitment to revitalizing the Haddon Avenue corridor and its critical infrastructure needs.

Improvements include

- Wider sidewalks for better pedestrian movement
- New asphalt pavement for a smoother, more durable roadway
- Curb and sidewalk extensions at signalized intersections for better visibility and shorter crossings
- Upgraded traffic signals for smoother traffic flow and safer crossings
- Upgraded intersection lighting for enhanced visibility and safety
- Improved access to public transit
- Green stormwater features at planting areas for improved drainage.
- Replacement of trees along the roadway

What to Expect during Construction

A construction project of this size will require patience, planning, and adjustments. We understand there will be challenges during construction - here's what you can expect:

- Crews will work manhole-to-manhole to clean and line existing underground pipes, completing the work with minimal traffic impacts.
- Utility upgrades to sanitary sewers, storm sewers, the water main, and water services will occur. Full closures of individual blocks will be required during this stage, with signed detour routes provided.
- Full roadway reconstruction will follow, block-by-block. During this phase, segments of Haddon Avenue will close with signed detour routes in place.
- Major cross-streets, including Newton Ave., Mt. Ephraim Ave., Kaighns Ave., and Ferry Ave., will remain open unless otherwise noted.
- Access for residents, businesses, and emergency vehicles will be maintained; any short-term restrictions will be coordinated in advance.
- Temporary off-street parking will be provided at various locations. *Visit project website for more information*.
- Trash, mail, and deliveries will continue with minimal disruption.
- Pedestrian and bike access will be maintained, with adjustments as needed.
- Access for through traffic on Haddon Avenue will be available on weekends (Friday 5:00 PM through Monday at 5:00 AM).
- Advanced notice of road work, including any detours, will be provided to the public.
